A Great Promise

I love children. Almost every facet of my life involves them. I have a two year old. I work as the youth minister here. I do a little bit of substitute teaching. Hardly a moment goes by that I don't have kids on my mind. Katie tells me that the reason that I get along with kids so well is that we have the same mentality! Whether that is the case or not, I am passionate about kids, trying to truly convert them to Christ, and helping them through "life stuff".

One other way that allows me to be involved in the lives of kids is the Lawrence County Foster Care Review Board. I became a member of this board a few years ago.

As I was reading in the book of John the other day, some of the children I've met through this came to my mind. Most of them have living parents, but, sadly, a few of them don't. Jesus said in John 14:18, "I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you." When I read that verse, some of the kids that I've met that are orphans came to my mind.

The goal that we have regarding these kids is to find them a forever home. Much of the time this happens. It doesn't always happen as quickly as we'd like, but we never lose sight of the goal.

Jesus, though, has given us all we need to meet every goal. He gave us an example of how to live. He showed us how to interact with friends, family, those who are hurting, and those who are trapped in sin. He gave us His blood. While we were still sinners, He died for us (Romans 5:8). He, through that blood, reconciles us to God, the Father. He gives us access to God through prayer as our High Priest.

In all that Christ did on earth, He displays the promise from John 14:18. He will not leave us orphans. He will come to us. He, from the context of this particular promise, left the Holy Spirit, the Spirit of truth, to help us. He will not leave us all alone.

Jesus wants you! He wants me. He wants our worst enemies. There isn't a soul on earth that He doesn't want. How can we know for sure? He made a promise. And, oh, what an amazing promise it is!
