Resolutions About Contentment

With the New Year upon us, there are many people making admirable resolutions. A lot of these will have to do with physical things: attempting to lose weight, making healthier menu choices, paying off some debt, or getting a better grip on time management. Perhaps there will be some spiritual resolutions made also, such as deciding to read the Bible and pray every day, with no exceptions; or maybe setting a goal to bring a certain number of people to Christ this year. It is an exciting time of year for a lot of people, and a great deal of that excitement can be attributed to this idea of a fresh start.

First, let's think about the idea of being content. Contentment is something that I would imagine we all struggle with to some degree. But, the Bible is consistent in teaching us that we should be satisfied with the things that we have. The following verses (1 Timothy 6:6, 8; Hebrews 13:5; Philippians 4:11) convey the idea of contentment:

"Now godliness with contentment is great gain...And having food and clothing, with these we shall be content."

"Let your conduct be without covetousness; be content with such things as you have. For He Himself has said, 'I will never leave you nor forsake you.'"

"Not that I speak in regard to need, for I have learned in whatever state I am, to be content."

Learning to be happy with the things that we have is obviously something that God wants us to master. This can be difficult, though, with the constant bombardment from the media suggesting that we need more and better things. But, as Paul went on to say in Philippians 4:13, "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." What a message of hope!

I also encourage all of us not to be content this year. You see, so frequently, we will strive to better ourselves in school, at our jobs, on our sports teams, and even within our hobbies, but we don't give the least bit of effort toward becoming more like Jesus. Perhaps we think to ourselves, "I go to church three times a week (or less, as is the case for most folks). That's good enough." I would imagine that some folks would think, "I know it would be easy for me to give more money to the church, but this should be enough." Thoughts such as these are dangerous and can keep us from our God.

The list could go on and on as far as things that we could be doing better. But, all too often, we are content to just get by with doing the same thing that we have always done. The problem with that is that we may very well have never really been converted to Christ. There's a chance that some of us never really decided to be a disciple of Jesus. It is likely that a great number of us never really have put very much effort into becoming like Him.

Content...complacent...satisfied...comfortable...relaxed...we can choose whatever synonym we like. These can tear the church apart. We must resolve to grow in Christ!

This year, if you haven't already, would you please make the resolution to be content with the things that you have, and not content with your current relationship with God and how much Christ can be seen in you?

Giving God The Glory

"The Lord lives, and blessed be my rock; and exalted be the God of my salvation, the God who executes vengeance for me, and subdues peoples under me. He delivers me from my enemies; surely You lift me above those who rise up against me; You rescue me from the violent man " (Psalm 18:47, 48).

Recalling all that God has given causes David to say in praise, "The LORD lives, and blessed be my rock." These words are written to extol God, who is the One behind all his successes. David prays, "Exalted be the God of my salvation," because He is the One who has done it.

What does God do for David? He is "the God who executes vengeance," the One who wins the battles and annihilates the foes. He is the One who "subdues peoples" and puts them under David. God brings subjugation to his foes but leadership to David.

For emphasis, he says, "He delivers me from my enemies." Then he prays, "Surely You lift me above those who rise up against me." God gives him victory over the enemy. "You rescue me from the violent man," David says. Evil, vicious men seek his life, but God enables him to overcome them.

God raised David to a place of international eminence. Foreign nations were subject to him. When they heard of his power, some immediately submitted to him. Others tried to stand against him but faded from opposing him like a flower without water before the sun. They soon came out of their strongholds and laid down their armor before their conqueror.

Key Thought: With David, we can praise God for what He has done for us. We can use the "therefore" of 1 Peter 5:6, 7: "Therefore humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you at the proper time, casting all your anxiety on Him, because He cares for you."
