I'm sure this is a question that many of us have either thought to ourselves or uttered aloud on several occasions. Maybe someone changed lanes and cut you off while talking on a cell phone and going about 15 mph over the speed limit. Perhaps the food you ordered came out wrong for the third straight time. Or, your spouse could have forgotten something that you told them about several times. A list of the stimuli for this exclaimed question could go on for quite some time, and we'd probably have a good time if we were to sit down with a friend to talk about them. What caused me to say this most recently, though (as of the time I wrote this), was while watching the Super Bowl this past Sunday night.

If you watched the game, you know that the Seahawks had a really good chance to win the game late. They had a second and goal from one yard out and decided to throw the ball. It was intercepted!
