Go Save My People!

God gave Moses a mission. Beginning in Exodus 3, we find the interaction between God and Moses detailing what God's plans were. As you are likely well aware, Moses lacked self-confidence concerning the task at hand and made several excuses. Let's look at the excuses he made and think about whether we make the same ones or not.

1. "Who am I to do this?" (Ex. 3:11)

This is the first statement of reluctance from Moses. He wonders why God chose him out of all the people that He could have chosen. Perhaps we make this same excuse. Do we leave it to the preacher, the elders, and other Christians to reach out into the world and save people? God is not satisfied with this excuse and gives a solution.

2. "Who sent you? What is his name?" (Ex. 3:13)

The second statement of reluctance from Moses seems to be a bit petty. Moses is already aware that he is speaking to God; God had told him in Exodus 3:6. For us, though, maybe we think we don't have a great enough grasp of who God is to be sent by Him to do His will. This excuse still does not stand. God is not satisfied with it and gives a solution.

3. "What if they don't believe me or won't listen? (Ex. 4:1)

In his third statement of reluctance, Moses doesn't even give the people – the ones that God desires him to go to – a chance. He writes them off before the message is even sent. Do we pick and choose who we take the gospel to? I believe that at times we neglect to share God's word with some people because we just don't think they will listen. God is not satisfied with this excuse either and gives a solution.

4. "I'm not a good speaker!" (Ex. 4:10)

In his fourth statement of reluctance, Moses refers to what he sees as his own inability. He is afraid that he won't know how to deliver the message or how to respond to what Pharaoh may have to say. At times we, too, will appeal to our personal weaknesses as an excuse not to take the life-saving gospel to those around us. God is not satisfied with this excuse and gives a solution.

5. "Just send anyone else!" (Ex. 4:13)

In his fifth and final statement of reluctance, Moses is grasping for any possible chance of not going before Pharaoh. Perhaps we have had these same feelings, thinking that someone else can take care of doing the things that God commands. However, just as is the case with the rest of the excuses that Moses made, God isn't satisfied and gives a solution.

Whatever problems we may encounter, God will give us the help that we need as long as we are going about things the way that He has asked us to! This was His continual message to Moses, and the same is true for us today.

You can do it! Now, go save souls!
