Closing it out:

This is one of the things that is pointed out by Solomon in the book of Ecclesiastes. In chapter one, he notes change as he begins contemplating such questions as "What is the meaning of life?" and "Is life worth living?" Verses 4-7 speak of various things in a cyclical manner. Even though changes continue to occur, the same things cycle around again. Each generation is replaced by the next, but the earth remains. The sun, winds, and waters all go from one place to another but end up right back where they seemed to start.

Perhaps, at times, some of us view changes in our lives in this way. God desires change in our lives. In fact, He commands it; it's called repentance. Have we, though, even while desiring to change and doing our part to be transformed so that we can become more like Christ, had in the back of our minds the idea of stumbling at some point? Maybe we make exceptions and have certain things that we are unwilling to change.

When it comes to changing the way we think so that we can be like Christ, we can't let that change be a cyclical one! Sure, we will make mistakes along the way, but we don't plan them out!

True repentance is hard. It requires daily effort and daily acknowledgement of our desire to do God's will. Let's make our change a daily one so that it sticks. God doesn't want a spin-cycle repentance.
