No Secret Disciples Allowed

Many people are fascinated by what goes on in the CIA. You've probably seen the movies or read the books. What is it about the CIA that captures the imagination of millions? I guess we could attribute this hype to its "mysteriousness." The CIA is the stuff of conspiracy theories. Its employees know something we don't. Due to the nature of this organization, many of the operatives are sworn to secrecy. In fact, many families have no idea that a CIA agent is in their midst. Because of the inherent danger of their job, CIA agents cloak their identity. They keep to the shadows. If they do their job well and live long enough, they will retire in anonymity.

In the Sermon on the Mount, after presenting those attitudes of the heart that should characterize each one of His followers (Matt. 5:1-12), Jesus moves to a discussion of influence (Matt. 5:13-16). He makes it clear that those of us who follow Him must let our lights shine (vs. 16). Hiding our lights is not an option (vs. 15). As far as Jesus is concerned, there is no such thing as secret discipleship. In other words, as followers of Christ, we cannot play the part of CIA agents. We should be open books for the world to read (cf. 2 Cor. 3:1-3). To whom we belong should not be a mystery.

Influencing the world for Christ is the clarion call of Christianity (cf. Luke 19:10; Matt. 28:18-20; Phil. 2:14-16). In the moments leading up to His arrest, Jesus prayed these words: "I do not ask that you take them out of the world. . . . As you sent me into the world, so have I sent them into the world" (John 17:15a, 18). To a large degree, our purpose for remaining in the world is for its sake, not just our own. For the world's sake, we cannot keep to the shadows. The world needs to know who we are by what we say and do. Despite the possibility of persecution or even death, we are not permitted to retire in anonymity (cf. John 9:21-23; 12:42-43; 19:38). Indeed, no secret disciples are allowed.
