The Purpose of Spiritual Exercises

About four decades ago, a body builder appeared on "The Mery Griffin Show." During the interview, Merv asked, "Why do you develop those particular muscles?" The body builder simply stepped forward and flexed a series of welldefined muscles from chest to calf. In response, the audience applauded. "What do you use all those muscles for?" Merv asked. Again, the muscular specimen flexed, and biceps and triceps sprouted to impressive proportions. "But what do you USE those muscles for?" Mery persisted. He didn't have an answer other than to display his well-developed frame (Gary Gulbranson, Leadership, 1989).

It seems that somewhere along the way this man forgot his purpose for building and strengthening his physical muscles. Maybe his purpose all along was to get to a point where he could woo audiences with his physique. Perhaps he just wanted them for beach attire. Whatever the case, Mr. Griffin exposed this man for who he really was.

We need to remind ourselves that our spiritual exercises (i.e. studying the Bible, praying, reflecting, fasting, attending worship services, etc.) exist for a purpose. They are meant to strengthen our ability in building up God's kingdom and to help us become more mature in Christ (Matt. 28:18-20; Eph. 4:11-16; Col. 1:28; 2 Tim. 3:16-17). They are not meant to improve our pose before an admiring audience (Matt. 6:1-7). Moreover, in our endeavor to develop bigger "spiritual muscles," it might help us to remember that God will one day expose us all for who we really are (Eccl. 12:14; Rom. 2:16; 1 Cor. 4:5).

Closing it out:

Our words are powerful! With them we have the ability to either bless or curse. They can either heal wounds or inflict them. While we may not take much stock of the words that we have to say, the Lord reminds us several times in Scripture of the power that our words hold. He warns against gossip, slander, filthy language, and the like. But, some of these things can become addictive. Then, once they become habit, perhaps we start to think less about just how damaging they can be.

There is a tombstone in Hatfield, Massachusetts on the grave of a lady named Arabella Young. She was only 29 years old when she died. Apparently she made an impact on the people that she knew, but it was not quite the impact that most would hope to make. A number of renderings have her epitaph as: "Here lies as silent clay | Miss Arabella Young | who on the 21st of May | began to hold her tongue." It seems as though she wasn't very well regarded for the way that she spoke of others.

What kind of words are we using? The Bible gives several descriptions of those that use their words for harm. Those that wound with their words are called fools (Proverbs 10:18), they are said to have evil hearts (Luke 6:45), they're called idle and busybodies (1 Timothy 5:13), they have defiled bodies (James 3:6), they deceive themselves (James 1:26), their throat is described as an open grave (Psalm 5:9), and they will have to answer for the damage that their words have done (Matthew 12:36).

It is pretty obvious to me just how dangerous the tongue can be. But, it can bring a message of hope when needed most. It can encourage when hope is lost. Our words can give strength to even the weakest. With our words, we can show others how great the love of God is. How are we using our words?
