A Good Name

After the American Civil War, the managers of the infamous Louisiana Lottery approached Robert E. Lee and asked if he'd let them use his name in their scheme. They promised that if he did he would become rich. Astounded, Lee straightened up, buttoned his gray coat, and shouted, "Gentlemen, I lost my home in the war. I lost my fortune in the war. I lost everything except my name. My name is not for sale, and if you fellows don't get out of here, I'll break this crutch over your heads!"

Minus the crutch-breaking, this brief story echoes the sentiment expressed in Proverbs 22:1, "A good name is to be chosen rather than great riches, and favor is better than silver or gold." Each of our names represents who we are. We become known by our name to all with whom we associate. Our reputation, or the opinion generally held of us, is always inextricably linked to our name. Indeed, our name and reputation are inseparable, and we should never lose sight of the fact that a good name is most certainly a priceless possession.

Today, let us resolve, if we haven't already, to build a good name, so that our names will bring honor, not shame, to the name of Christ.

Though everyone appreciates the praise of others, yet, we should not go around seeking accolades from our peers. Neither do Christians become insecure and disturbed if they are overlooked when commendations are given.

It is a great matter to desire genuine virtues, but it is just as great to desire to conceal them.
