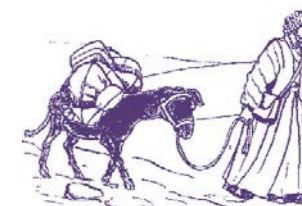

Christ-like Service (Part 2)

Christianity is not simply a mental exercise. If Christianity does not have an effect on what you do and say, then it becomes—to quote William Shakespeare—“full of sound and fury, signifying nothing.” You can study the Bible until you die and understand what it says and means, but if what it teaches you does not turn into action or into something visible, then the “room” you long for in heaven will not be there when this life is over (cf. Matt. 7:21; James 2:14-26).

Have you ever put into perspective the picture that Jesus gives us of the judgment in Matthew 25:31-46? It is interesting to note what Jesus identifies as the dividing line between the sheep and the goats. The sheep show in action the love, compassion, and kindness of Jesus Christ (vv. 35-36); the goats fail to do so (vv. 42-43). In other words, the sheep, not the goats, exemplify Christ-like service.

Furthermore, both the sheep and the goats ask Jesus a series of questions. Both groups want to know when they saw Jesus hungry, estranged, naked, sick, and imprisoned. Jesus’ response makes this passage even more powerful: “Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me” (vs. 40; cf. vs. 45). Jesus identifies Himself with those whom we serve. The sheep served Him; the goats did not.

Christ-like service is not optional; it is expected. The overarching motivation for our service to others is that of serving the Christ, and He served us even to the point of death (Phil. 2:7-8). At the judgment, could there possibly be any good excuses for not reciprocating the Christ’s service to us?
