A Thinking Faith

Os Guinness, who has written several thought-provoking books on our society's transition from modernity to post-modernity, claims that we are a generation that has "dumbed down" everything that is important to the level of bumper stickers, billboards, and Hallmark cards. One revealing bumper sticker of the type Guinness has in mind reads as follows: "There is no right and wrong—only fun and boring." This is a sad indication of where some people are these days when it comes to discerning between good and evil: "If it's fun, it's good; if it's boring, it's evil." Such a mindset relinquishes rationality and substance, while enthroning feelings and superficiality. It also speaks to the fact that many people in the world today desire to be constantly entertained as opposed to engaging in any kind of critical thinking.

Christianity was designed by God to be a "thinking" faith. In other words, one cannot develop faith by bypassing the mind. God expects people to consider, reason, analyze, and study (cf. John 6:26; Acts 17:11; 1 Thess. 5:21; 1 Pet. 3:15). God chose to provide us with a special revelation of Himself in written form, i.e. the Bible, and it demands careful exegesis and faithful interpretation. The Bible is too rich and too important to be relegated to a bumper sticker.

To allow ourselves to be pressed into the world's mold of superficiality and entertainment without careful reflection based on Scripture would be a terrible loss. God wants us to use the brains that He gave us, while Satan wants us to stay dumb. So, let us resolve to critically engage and faithfully examine God's word, while encouraging others to do so as well.
