Seeing the Big Picture

In reading the Bible, you can become so overwhelmed by the miscellaneous facts of the Bible that you miss or forget the mesmerizing focus of the Bible. Yes, even when it comes to studying Scripture, it is possible to miss the forest for the trees.

The most basic division of the Bible is that of “testaments,” “covenants,” or “compacts” between God and His people. Both of the testaments are centered on the Christ. The Old Testament views Christ by way of anticipation; the New Testament views Him by way of realization. What is commenced in the Old Testament is completed in the Christ of the New Testament. Prevision becomes provision. The promises of salvation in the Old Testament are brought to fruition in the presence of Christ in the New Testament (Matt. 1:21; 2 Cor. 1:20). In short, the Old Testament is the New Testament concealed; the New Testament is the Old Testament revealed (Norman Geisler, *A Popular Survey of the Old Testament*).

Without question, the Bible is the most vital book in the world. Its supreme subject is the Lord Jesus Christ. Its supreme object is the salvation of human beings. Its supreme project is the reign of Jesus in the lives of believers (J. Sidlow Baxter, *Explore the Book*).

So, in your study of God’s Word in the future, make it your goal not to lose sight of the big picture. As Edwin Jones, an instructor at the Southeast Institute of Biblical Studies, once said, “We can go to heaven without knowing the length of Og’s bed; we cannot enter there without knowing the Christ” (John 17:3).

Recently, some impeccable timing allowed me to think about a passage in a way that caused it to make more sense to me than it ever had before. I had been reading through the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 5-7 last week and reminiscing about how Savana Cook used to call Matthew 5:2-12 the "Big Attitudes". Then, it happened.

Penelope was hungry. She, as normally seems to be the case when she gets home from preschool, was tired, hungry, and needed to be satisfied. I tried to get her to calm down and wait. "We'll be eating supper in just a little bit," I told her. My efforts were to no avail. She was going to insist on eating until someone got something for her. A cold hot dog (her favorite way to eat them) did the trick.

"Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied." – Matthew 5:6

I don't know how many times I had read or heard that verse, but, for the first time, I completely understood it. When babies are hungry, they cry. They don't stop until they have been satisfied. The same is true for toddlers, and, in some cases, folks that go by the name "Jeremy" that are in their thirties. Not only is a need felt, it is cried out for!

Those that hunger and thirst for righteousness realize that they need that – the righteousness of God – more than any other thing. They will not stop until they are satisfied. And, they will be satisfied. They will have a relationship with God, and it is a relationship that will last for eternity. It is a relationship that provides peace, assurance and hope. It is a relationship that no one can take away. Don't you want that? Don't we need that? How hungry are we?
