To See What We Do Not See Now

Centuries ago, Augustine wrote the following words: "Faith is to believe in what we do not see, and the reward of faith is to see what we believe."

Our faith involves unseen things. The Hebrews writer provides us with this definition of faith: "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen" (11:1). Did you catch that? I'm sure you did. Faith is "the conviction of things *not seen*."

I did not see Jesus when He walked upon this earth. I did not see Him walk upon the water or raise Lazarus from the dead. I did not witness His death, burial, and resurrection. I cannot provide you with personal eyewitness testimony of Jesus' ascension into heaven. Furthermore, I have never seen heaven or hell so as to possess empirical evidence that these places exist. I suspect that you are in the same boat.

However, just because you and I did not see these things with our own eyes does not mean it would be ludicrous to believe in these things or to put our trust in God whom we have not seen. As the Hebrews writer affirms throughout chapter 11, faith rests upon a solid foundation. Faith is not a blind leap into the dark. To support our belief in unseen things, we have the intricacies of the universe (Rom. 1:20; cf. Heb. 11:3) and the infallibility of God's Word (2 Tim. 3:16-17; Rom. 10:7; cf. Heb. 11:7). With this foundation firmly fixed, we should not be ashamed to say with Paul that "we walk by faith, not by sight" (2 Cor. 5:7).

Nevertheless, what will the outcome of our faith be? Simply put, it will be to see what we do not see now. Perhaps the apostle John put it best: "Beloved, we are God's children now, and what we will be has not yet appeared; but we know that when He appears we shall be like Him, because we shall see Him as He is" (1 John 3:2). Indeed, when the world comes to an end, our faith will be turned to sight.

Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed.
