What Do You See?

Isaac Watts sat down in 1707 and wrote words that have echoed for a little over three centuries:

When I survey the wondrous cross,
On which the Prince of glory died
My richest gain I count but loss
And pour contempt on all my pride.

Forbid it, Lord, that I should boast,
Save in the death of Christ, my Lord;
All the vain things that charm me most
I sacrifice them to His blood.

Today, not everyone is united on what the cross of Christ should mean to humanity. To some people, it is ridiculous to think that the death of a Jew on a Roman cross somehow provided a way for mankind to be rescued from their sins. To others, it is everything, just as it was for Isaac Watts.

The apostle Paul observed this same division in his first letter to the Corinthian church: "For the word of the cross is folly to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God" (1 Cor. 1:18). Paul also adds that the crucifixion of Christ was "a stumbling block to Jews and folly to Gentiles" (1 Cor. 1:23). Indeed, when unbelievers survey the cross, they do not see anything worthy of their devotion and sacrifice; however, when believers survey the cross, they see not only their sin, but also love, forgiveness, and hope. I see One who is worthy of my very life. Oh, that everyone would see what I see!

What do you see when you survey the cross? What you see is indicative of where you stand in terms of eternity.

"But far be it from me to boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ,
by which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world."
Galatians 6:14

In Mark 12, we find a conversation recorded between Jesus and a scribe. This scribe had just heard how Jesus responded to some Sadducees, and he began speaking with Jesus after seeing how well He had answered them. The scribe asked Jesus this question in verse 28; "Which commandment is the most important of all?" Jesus' response, in a nutshell, is something that is common to us and should be a theme for us to live by; God wants those that He loves so much to love Him, and He wants us to love our fellow human beings, too.

Once again, the scribe likes what he hears from Jesus. He commends Jesus and tells Him that He is right. Verse 34 tells us Jesus saw that the scribe answered wisely. Then He makes a declaration that can be a bit puzzling. "You are not far from the kingdom of God." I used to read that as a compliment, and on some level, I suppose it is. But, since he was "not far", there was something that still wasn't exactly right. What was missing? Well, the scribe didn't realize that Jesus was the Son of God – the very one who would take on sin and die as a substitution for him. Sure, he wasn't far, but he was still separated.

Am I "not far" from the kingdom today? Are you "not far"? If so, what is it that is separating you and me from God? The Bible gives us no indication as to whether this particular scribe ever removed that separation and became a part of the kingdom. But, we have the opportunity to do so if there is, in fact, something keeping us disconnected from God. If there is anything between you and your Creator, take care of it today!
