Fan or Follower?

Well, I'm sure most of you are aware that it's football time in Tennessee . . . and in every other state across America. If you got out of the house this past Saturday, you probably saw orange shirts everywhere you went. If you did not get out of the house, perhaps all you had to do was look in the mirror. It was game day, and people were wearing their UT orange with pride. Of course, fans of other teams also made an appearance. I saw some Alabama red, Georgia red, and South Carolina red. Fans of these respective teams will tell you that there is a difference in the reds just as there is a difference between Tennessee orange and Florida orange.

I have talked to several people who attended UT's first game of the season in Nashville. In fact, over 60,000 people squeezed their way into Nissan Stadium (a.k.a. LP Field), grabbed some concessions, found their seat, and fought the heat while watching the game and screaming their lungs out. I've been there, and I must say that it's exciting. At intervals, you boo the refs, cheer for the players, critique the coaches, crunch the stats, sit in silence during a tense moment or momentum shift, or lose your mind after a big play or score. Why do we do these things? Because that's what good fans do.

I think Jesus has a lot of fans these days—fans who sit safely in the stands (or pews) cheering (or praising), but they know nothing of the sacrifice or pain of the field (or the Christian life). After all, a fan is nothing more than an enthusiastic admirer. A fan yells and cheers, but nothing is really required of him or her. In his book *Not a Fan*, Kyle Idleman writes, "My concern is that many of our churches in America have gone from being sanctuaries to becoming stadiums. And every week all the fans come to the stadium where they cheer for Jesus but have no interest in truly following him. The biggest threat to the church today is fans who call themselves Christians but aren't actually interested in following Christ. They want to be close enough to Jesus to get all the benefits, but not so close that it requires anything from them" (25).

I don't think Jesus is interested in having fans; He desires followers. In John 6, Jesus goes from having thousands of raving fans to having nothing more than a small band of genuine followers. The fans wanted the food that Jesus could provide them (vs. 26). Once Jesus became the only thing on the menu (vv. 35, 41, 53-58), they no longer had any interest in Him (vs. 66). They walked away from Jesus, and it's interesting to note that neither Jesus nor His followers chased after them. When it comes to sports, fandom is okay. When it comes to Jesus, fandom is unacceptable.
