Prizing Forgiveness

A law professor tells the story of a woman who had been unfaithful to her husband. In response to her infidelity, the husband forgave her and took her back. However, after some time had passed, the woman repeated her unfaithfulness. When her husband confronted her this time, she pushed him so that he fell and died. At the trial, the judge said before sentencing her, "Obviously, she did not prize her forgiveness."

In 1 Timothy 1:15, the apostle Paul writes, "The saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the foremost." Paul's statement here implies that he prized the forgiveness he received through Christ. He went from being a persecutor of Christians to being persecuted as a Christian. The forgiveness he found through Christ became the driving force behind his life (1 Tim. 1:12-17; 1 Cor. 15:10). It is what sustained him and moved him to reach for "the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus" (Phil. 3:14).

For those of us who have obeyed the gospel (Acts 2:38; 8:35-38; Rom. 6:17), we, like Paul, received forgiveness from God through Christ. Indeed, our sins were washed away to be remembered no more (Acts 22:16; cf. Heb. 10:17). Upon reenacting the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ (Rom. 6:1-6), we were encouraged to "no longer live for [ourselves] but for Him who for [our] sake died and was raised" (2 Cor. 5:15). Upon receiving forgiveness, we were called "to walk in the same way in which [Jesus] walked" (1 John 2:6). Upon receiving the benefits of Jesus' sacrifice, we were instructed "to present [our] bodies as a living sacrifice" (Rom. 12:1). In other words, the lives we lead after receiving forgiveness should demonstrate that we prize our forgiveness. Does your life indicate that you prize your forgiveness?
