Forgiveness

If we lived in a world where everyone was perfect, I think we would probably be able to find the word "forgiveness" in a dictionary, but it would not be a word that we truly understand, appreciate, or implement. In a world of flawless people, forgiveness would simply be an idea, not a reality. Being perfect, we would handle all situations without fault. Our speech would always be above reproach. We would never disappoint. Our choices, no matter the situation, would be impeccable. Our character would be forever unassailable. Enemies would be the stuff of fiction. Forgiveness would be unfathomable.

Yet, the fact is we live in a world where everyone is fallible (Rom. 3:10-18, 23). Being imperfect, we make mistakes on a daily basis. We say things that break the hearts of others. We do things on occasion that alienate relatives and friends. Our minds are sometimes cluttered with images and thoughts that leave us feeling depressed, useless, and forsaken. Our lives are marred in more ways than one, and the idea of forgiveness has become to us a most desirable thing, if not a necessity. Without question, everyone stands to be forgiven not only by others but also by God Himself.

Our greatest need in this life is to receive forgiveness from God. We have all wronged Him. In fact, we are all responsible for nailing His Son, who needed no forgiveness, to a cross (1 Cor. 5:21; 1 Pet. 2:24). However, because of His unbelievable love for us, God freely gave us His Son to die in our place (John 3:16; Rom. 5:6-10). Through Jesus' death, God was able to offer us a forgiveness that cleanses us from all sin (1 John 1:5—2:2). Interestingly enough, one of the conditions we must meet in order to enjoy God's forgiveness centers upon the practice of forgiving others. Jesus said, "For if you forgive others for their transgressions, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive others, then your Father will not forgive your transgressions" (Matt. 6:14-15; cf. 18:21-35).

We live in a fallen world of fallible people. We hurt others and are hurt by others. If Jesus, who never hurt others, could look out over a crowd of people who were bent on destroying Him and say, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do" (Luke 23:34), then surely we can find it within ourselves to forgive others as He did, especially when we realize that, unlike Him, we often hurt others and are frequently in need of forgiveness.
