The Humiliation of Christ

The title for this article is an expression that is commonly used to refer to the earthly life of Jesus Christ in contrast to His pre-existent state in heaven with the Father and His subsequent exaltation after His death, burial, and resurrection. In other words, Christ's "humiliation" began with His incarnation and ended when He sat down at the right hand of God (cf. Phil. 2:6-11; Heb. 1:3; 10:12).

The fact of Christ's "humiliation" was more than suggested in certain statements made by the Lord Himself. In His conversation with Nicodemus, Jesus said, "No one has ascended into heaven except He who descended from heaven, the Son of Man" (John 3:13). Later, He asked the following question of His disciples: "Then what if you were to see the Son of Man ascending to where He was before?" (John 6:62). In John 16:28, Jesus brings the previous two sentiments together: "I came forth from the Father and have come into the world; I am leaving the world again and going to the Father." In harmony with Jesus' own statements and the declared facts of our Lord's stay upon this earth, the apostle Paul said, "He humbled himself" (Phil. 2:8). But what exactly did Christ's "humiliation" involve?

First of all, Christ voluntarily left heaven to come to earth (Phil. 2:6-7). He chose not to hold onto equality with God; consequently, He became poor for our sake (2 Cor. 8:9). Secondly, not only did He enter into union with human nature, but Christ also became subject to the same temptations and sufferings of mankind, though refraining from sin (Heb. 4:14-16; Rom. 8:3). In essence, God, in the form of man, became vulnerable. Third, Christ was "born under the law" (Gal. 4:4-5), meaning that He was subjected to the legal measures and obligations appropriate only for human beings. Fourth, Christ became the representative of sinners (2 Cor. 5:21). He stood in our place—a place He did not deserve. Fifth, Christ sacrificed Himself by dying on a cross of supreme humiliation (Matt. 27:33-50; Heb. 12:2). Even His own Father who sent Him to earth arguably had to look away (Matt. 27:46). All these things are compounded by the fact that while on this earth, He was persecuted, scorned, mocked, questioned, disrespected, rejected, and beaten.

On this side of eternity, we will never be able to comprehend fully the significance and far-reaching implications of the Son's choice to leave heaven, come to earth, live among men, and die by their hands. What I can comprehend, though, is that He did it for you and me. He did it so that you and I might live with Him forever in the place from which He came and later returned (Heb. 2:5-18).
