Loyalty Goes Both Ways

Loyalty is something that gets at a person's heart. We prize loyalty. We desire loyalty from others. Others desire our loyalty. It is the stuff of which relationships are made. In fact, it is hard to conceive of any genuine relationship where loyalty is nonexistent, and loyalty goes both ways. If either party chooses not to remain loyal, a breach in the relationship occurs.

On six separate occasions in the book of Jeremiah, it is written, "I will be your God, and you shall be my people" (7:23; cf. 11:4; 24:7; 30:22; 31:33; 32:38). This is the most basic summary found in the Bible of the relationship between God and His people, and it was first pronounced on Mount Sinai (Exod. 6:7; Lev. 26:12; Deut. 26:17-18; cf. Ezek. 11:20; 14:11; 34:30; 36:28; 37:23, 27; Hos. 1:9-10; 2:23). Of course, what was once true of the relationship between God and Israel is now true of the relationship between God and the church that was purchased with the blood of His Son (Jer. 31:33; Heb. 8:10). Christians are called to reciprocate God's loyalty to them.

Jesus is the epitome of loyalty. Not only was He loyal to the Father, but He was loyal to us. When the devil himself tempted Jesus with everything under the sun, He remained faithful to His Father (Matt. 4:1-11). Time and time again He was ridiculed by the religious leaders of His day, yet He did not waver. On one occasion, many of His disciples deserted Him (John 6:66), but He remained true to His calling. When His suffering was imminent, He stayed the course (Luke 9:51). When His back was writhing in pain from the flogging, He did not recant, resist, or flee. When He was spit upon and mocked, He kept His focus. When the nails were driven into His wrists, He did not call twelve legions of angels to rescue Him. When He hoisted Himself up on the nails, gasping for air, He remained steadfast, knowing that this is what He came to this earth to accomplish. This was His obligation to the Father. This was His supreme task. This was His purpose. We needed Him to remain loyal to His mission. We needed Him to die in our place, and He did.

So, let's get rid of whatever idols have taken up residence in our hearts. Let's start treating people right. Let's love our brothers and sisters in Christ in word and deed. Let's stop missing worship services and Bible studies. Let's make time for God every day. Let's be devoted spouses and parents. Let's be obedient children. Let's share the story of Jesus with others. All of these things demonstrate our loyalty to the One who endured our punishment and never turned back. In view of Jesus' loyalty to us, what possible justification or excuse do we have for not remaining loyal to Him?

But, when you put them all together they take on a level of deliciousness that any one of them can't reach alone.

While this analogy could be applied to many passages of Scripture, the one that jumped out at me was Romans 12:9; "Let love be without hypocrisy. Abhor what is evil; cling to what is good." If we were to take any of those three commands alone, it would still be a good thing. You won't find anything that tells you not to hate evil in the Bible. What if we never focused on loving and clinging to good things, though? You see, when we put all of these things together, it becomes complete. Leaving one of the parts out would be like trying to eat a grilled cheese without the cheese...it just wouldn't make sense. The Bible is a book that we have to take completely. When we do, we can know everything we need to know about life and how to live it!
