Surrendering Our Swords

Britain claims no greater naval hero than Lord Horatio Nelson, the British admiral from the eighteenth century. In one of the Napoleonic wars, Lord Nelson defeated the French navy. The defeated French admiral brought his flagship alongside Nelson's vessel and went aboard to make his surrender. With a sword swinging at his side, he walked up to the British admiral and extended his hand. Lord Nelson made no gesture, but quietly said, "Your sword first, sir."

In Matthew 4:17, one of the overarching themes of Jesus' preaching while on this earth is revealed: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand" (cf. Matt. 4:23; 9:35; 24:14; Luke 4:43; 9:1-2; Acts 1:3). We commonly use the term "kingdom" to describe a territory or a people within a territory. However, one of the primary ways "kingdom" is used in the Bible is of the right to rule or of the authority of the sovereign. Take Daniel 4, for instance. God threatens to take away Nebuchadnezzar's kingdom in a dream. God is not threatening to take away the people of Babylon or remove the borders of Babylon. In fact, when God's threat became a reality, His message from heaven to Nebuchadnezzar was "sovereignty has been removed from you" (Dan. 4:31).

When Jesus spoke of the "kingdom of heaven," He was saying that through Him the God of heaven was establishing His dominion, or rule, in the hearts of men. Jesus was calling people to accept God's reign in their lives. We cannot be our own sovereign; we cannot allow other "kingdoms" to rule our lives. Indeed, that's why Jesus began His message concerning the kingdom of God with a call to repentance. With the word "Repent," Jesus essentially says, "Give up your other kingdoms. Surrender your kingdoms. Stop fighting for these other kingdoms" (cf. Matt. 6:24; 10:34-39). These "kingdoms" are anywhere that God's reign is rejected or reviled and our will is done instead. Indeed, like the French admiral before Lord Nelson, we cannot surrender our souls to God until we have first surrendered our swords.
