How's Your Spiritual Health?

My guess is that you probably recognize at least five or more of the following: P90X, Weight Watchers, Insanity, Nutrisystem, T25, Jenny Craig, Zumba, Atkins Diet, CrossFit, South Beach Diet, Jazzercise, Paleo Diet, Yoga, Mediterranean Diet, Tae Bo, Biggest Loser Diet, and Sweatin' to the Oldies. Whether it's building muscle mass or shedding pounds, these programs exist to improve a person's physical health. Of course, they have also made their inventors and promoters quite wealthy. It's been estimated that Americans spend somewhere between forty and fifty billion dollars a year on fitness products. Our society undoubtedly places a high premium on exercising daily, eating well, looking good, and prolonging one's life.

Obviously, there is nothing inherently wrong with being a health-conscious human being who desires to look good and live a long life. In fact, a biblical case could be made that we should be good stewards of our bodies, not just our money and time (cf. 1 Cor. 6:19-20). But should this be a person's highest priority? Unfortunately, some people, operating under the assumption that this life is all there is, have gone so far as to make their physical health an exclusive priority and have given little thought or time to their spiritual health. In 1 Timothy 4:7b-8, the apostle Paul provides the proper perspective: "Train yourself for godliness; for while bodily training is of some value, godliness is of value in every way, as it holds promise for the present life and also for the life to come." Paul does not dismiss or discount improving one's physical health and even admits that it has value; nevertheless, he indicates that a healthy spirit is more valuable than a healthy body, since the former, not the latter, has ties to the life hereafter.

In 3 John, the shortest book of the New Testament, the apostle John addresses a man by the name of Gaius. John opens his personal letter with this prayer for Gaius: "May you be as healthy physically and financially as you are spiritually" (vs. 2, paraphrase mine). How many of us would be comfortable with such a prayer on our behalf? What would you look like if your physical health was a reflection of your spiritual health? Would your physical health change for the better or worse? Would you be a ripped physical specimen of a human being fit for the Olympics, or would you be a gaunt, lifeless shell of a human being fit for the grave? What would your finances look like if they were a reflection of your spiritual health? Would you be a prince or a pauper? John's prayer for Gaius is complimentary of Gaius. Gaius was evidently a spiritually healthy man; otherwise, John would have never uttered such a prayer. What about you? Are you spiritually healthy?
