Are You Open?

Sometimes I forget that it is a holiday and drive to the bank to deposit a needed check, only to see a sign on the door that reads "Closed." Frustrating.

On one summer night a few years ago, my wife and I were craving some Maggie Moo's Ice Cream. We made the thirty-minute trek from our home in Maryville to the nearest Maggie Moo's, only to see that the neon sign that read "Open" was not lit up. They were closed. Disappointing.

On one occasion, my gas light came on during a stretch of the interstate where exits were few and far between. As more and more mile markers swept by, I began to get nervous. When I came to the next exit, I got off and made my way to the nearest gas station. The sign on the door said, "We're Closed." Troubling.

Now, there is something that is far more frustrating, disappointing, and troubling than a closed bank, ice cream shop, or gas station, and that is a heart that is not open to God. What is the sign on the door of your heart saying to God? Open 24 hours? Closed?

As you are contemplating your honest response to this question, keep three things in mind: (1) God will not come into your heart uninvited (Rev. 3:20); (2) opening your heart up to God involves giving your entire life to God, not just one or two days a week (Rom. 6:5-14); (3) once the door closes on your life or Jesus returns, you will not be able to exchange a closed sign for an open one (Luke 13:22-29).

Closing it out:

Many times during a bible class or sermon, the person leading the class or preaching will give the definition of a specific word. It may go something like this: "According to Merriam-Webster, the definition of paragon is 'a person or thing that is perfect or excellent in some way and should be considered a model, or example, to be copied.'" Dictionaries can be useful when explaining concepts found in scripture to give a deeper definition of a word or phrase.

While I have, on many occasions, looked up definitions of words for Bible classes and for preaching purposes, I have never thought to look the definition of the word "definition." So, what, according to Merriam-Webster, is the definition of definition? Well, here are three of the results that are offered: 1) an explanation of the meaning of a word, phrase, etc.; a statement that defines a word, phrase, etc. 2) a statement that describes what something is; a statement expressing the essential nature of something; 3) a clear or perfect example of a person or thing. The second option proposed is one that I want us to think about briefly. "A statement that describes what something is." That is an idea that I suggest we should think about in regards to at least three aspects of our lives.

First, what defines me within my family? Am I the kind of parent, child, or sibling that I should be? Are there areas where I need improvement so that my family could function more properly?

Second, what defines us as a congregation of God's people at Pulaski Street? Do we have a good reputation in this community? Are there things that we/I can do to improve it?

Third, what defines me as a Christian? Do my actions and desires support my claims? When others think of me, do they consider me to be a person that is trying to live like Jesus?

What defines us should be very important to us! If what we perceive others to think about us isn't what we would like it to be, then we should make the necessary changes!

So, let's ask ourselves the question one more time; what defines us?
