The Greatest of Tragedies

Within just the past fifteen years or so, humanity has witnessed an alarming number of tragedies. Thousands of people have lost their lives in terrorist attacks, wars, mass shootings, and natural calamities. It seems like scarcely a week goes by that we don't hear about something horrible happening somewhere. Even beyond those tragedies that make the national news, we have our own personal tragedies that we could add to the list.

To some, it might seem foolish to claim that there is a particular tragedy that trumps them all. This endeavor could be perceived by some to be insensitive: "How dare you try to put one tragedy above another, much less one tragedy above them all!" I am not seeking to minimize any given tragedy. When just one human being loses his/her life, it is tragic. Nevertheless, I do believe that there is a particular tragedy that we can point to that stands above all the rest.

There they were in a beautiful garden, walking with God and being blessed by God. Only one condition was given if they were to remain in this paradise: "But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you will surely die" (Gen. 2:17). God's commandment was clear, concise, and simple. However, an intruder appeared in the garden, and he told Adam and Eve that they would not die if they partook of the tree (Gen. 3:4). They believed him; consequently, they began to die physically. Here is the origin of physical death for us all (cf. Rom. 5:12-14). We all have to deal with this consequence in our own personal lives and on a worldwide scale as well. Such an observation might lead us to conclude that the fall of Adam of Eve constitutes the greatest of tragedies.

However, for those of us who are spiritually minded, there is more to see here. Adam and Eve not only began to die physically, but they also died spiritually. Instead of becoming like God, a wall was erected between them and God. What happened to them is still happening today all over this world. There is nothing more tragic than when a human being exchanges the truth of God for a lie so as to becoming spiritually separated from God. So, it could be argued that the greatest of tragedies is not seen in one specific calamity or event; rather, the greatest of tragedies is seen or experienced whenever a person created by God is alienated from God.

Interestingly enough, each and every accountable human being has experienced the greatest of tragedies, for "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Rom. 3:23; cf. Isa. 59:1-2). But thanks be to God that He provided a way for us to be reconciled to Him through the tragic death of His Son (2 Cor. 5:18-21). It took a tragedy to rescue us from the greatest of tragedies.
