Some professed Christians are all about believing but not about belonging. In their estimation, being an integral part of a local congregation is optional, if not unnecessary or even precarious. Various reasons exist as to why those of this mindset downplay or disparage one's involvement with a local body of Christians. Some are disillusioned by all the division and fragmentation that they see among adherents of Christianity. Others simply desire to be nonconformists. Still others have been "burned" by a local congregation in the past. While each one of these reasons demands a response, there is one particular reason that I want to highlight and address in this article. One too many people have either carelessly or deliberately overlooked the New Testament's emphasis on the congregational, or corporate, facet of living the Christian life.

Now, if what I am about to share below is to have an impact on someone else, that person would have to view the New Testament as a God-breathed product that is normative for Christian beliefs and practices (cf. 2 Tim. 3:15-16; 2 Pet. 3:15-17). Though what follows is not exhaustive, it sufficiently demonstrates that refusing to become a part of a local congregation of God's people is a violation of God's will for His people:

Be at peace with one another (Mark 9:50) Love one another (John 13:34; 1 John 4:7) Be devoted to one another (Rom. 12:10) Honor one another (Rom. 12:10) Live in harmony with one another (Rom. 12:16) Build up one another (Rom. 14:19) Accept one another (Rom. 15:7) Instruct one another (Rom. 15:14) Greet one another (Rom. 16:16; 2 Cor. 13:12) Have equal concern for one another (1 Cor. 12:25) Serve one another (Gal. 5:13; cf. John 13:14) Bear one another's burden (Gal. 6:2)

I'm sure you noticed the phrase "one another." It represents the significant fact that Christians must not live in isolation. They are called to interact with one another in the context of a local congregation. God never intended for any Christian to travel the narrow way alone. In fact, He has unambiguously commanded Christians not to try to do it on their own. To refuse to interact with fellow Christians is to live in defiance of the clear teaching of Scripture.

Closing it out:

Jesus talked about how much it would cost to be a follower of His. He taught that there couldn't be anything more important than following Him and doing the will of God. Additionally, we have several songs in our song book that talk about the same concept; songs such as "Have You Counted the Cost?," "I Surrender All," and "I Have Decided to Follow Jesus," among many others. This theme is clear in the Gospel and a great one for us to consider regularly.

This theme reminded me of an excerpt that I read in Wayne and Janet Barrier's book, *Missionary Stories*. The year was 1997, and Wayne Barrier was on his first trip to Myanmar. At the time it was illegal for more than 5 people, other than family members, to be gathered together for any reason. They had just completed a worship service where close to 25 people were gathered together, all while soldiers were patrolling the streets nearby. Wayne asked the woman whose home they had met in to worship what would happen if one of the soldiers were to come in while they were meeting. Her response is amazing and very much signifies the kind of commitment that Jesus taught to be necessary.

"(If a soldier were to come in)...they would take all of us down to the police station. After a few questions, they would send you home on the first plane out of the country. They would keep the rest of us in jail, maybe a month, and then they would let everyone go except for Winsome (her daughter) and myself. They would keep us indefinitely, possibly the rest of our lives. But it would be worth it, just to get the Gospel to this country."

Do we have this kind of commitment to the Lord? "Commit your way to the Lord; trust in Him, and He will act." – Psalm 37:5
