**Go to the Ant**

Do you believe that our society is raising a generation of kids that are allergic to work? Many seem to think so, and they may be right. Nevertheless, we should probably refrain from overstating the case. While I personally know some young people who are the epitome of lazy, I also know some who are quite the opposite. Furthermore, there are a host of people in their 30s, 40s, and 50s who are slothful. Although some people would like to classify laziness or idleness as a preference, it should be recognized that the Bible classifies it as a sin.

In Proverbs 6:6-11, Solomon writes: "Go to the ant, O sluggard; consider her ways, and be wise. Without having any chief, officer, or ruler, she prepares her bread in summer and gathers her food in harvest. How long will you lie there, O sluggard? When will you arise from your sleep? A little sleep, a little slumber, a little folding of the hands to rest, and poverty will come upon you like a robber, and want like an armed man" (cf. Prov. 24:30-34). In this passage, the wisest of men invites the lazy person to consider one of the busiest creatures on the face of this planet: the ant. Though an ant has no taskmaster over it, it feverishly works to provide for itself and others, demonstrating remarkable self-discipline and diligence. Consequently, the lazy person should take a page from the ant's book. Solomon concludes by highlighting "poverty" and "want," which are close synonyms, as the consequences of being lazy, using the image of a robber and a warrior to typify their sudden and strong impact. Without question, to be pleasing to God, one must be diligent (i.e. wise), not lazy (i.e. foolish). There are a host of other proverbs that relate to this same theme (cf. Prov. 10:4, 26; 12:24; 18:9; 19:24; 21:25; 22:13; 26:13-16).

In 2 Thessalonians 3:6-10, the apostle Paul writes: "Now we command you, brothers, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that you keep away from any brother who is walking in idleness and not in accord with the tradition that you received from us. For you yourselves know how you ought to imitate us, because we were not idle when we were with you, nor did we eat anyone's bread without paying for it, but with toil and labor we worked night and day, that we might not be a burden to any of you. It was not because we do not have that right, but to give you in ourselves an example to imitate. For even when we were with you, we would give you this command: If anyone is not willing to work, let him not eat." There is obviously a difference between being unable to work and being unwilling to work. Those who are unable to work deserve our compassion. Being idle or lazy, however, is not only grounds for being dis-fellowshipped, but it also flies in the face of the example of Paul.

Let's resolve to be conscientious and industrious in providing for our families and serving the Lord. Let's commit ourselves to teaching our children and others a good work ethic. If you like to use object lessons, don't forget the ant.
