There Is Hope!

Samuel Johnson once wrote, "Where there is no hope, there can be no endeavor." Indeed, if something is truly hopeless, then to long for it or pursue it is futile. If a boy really has no hope of getting the girl, then what sense would it make for the boy to continue in his efforts to woo the girl? If he chose to pursue her despite the absence of hope, his friends may admire him for his tenacity; however, if they truly cared about him, they would remind him in the gentlest way possible that there are other fish in the sea. No hope; no endeavor.

If we really had no hope of having our sins forgiven by God, what would that mean for our lives? Well, we would obviously stand condemned before God. Heaven would be a pipe dream; hell would await us all. The same could be said if Christ had not been raised from the dead (1 Cor. 15:16-19). It would be a waste of time and effort to search and strive for something that was truly hopeless. Thus, our best course of action would be to abandon our pursuit of heaven and to look for significance and consolation in other things. Of course, some people may still attempt to keep the hope of heaven alive; however, if heaven were truly a hopeless pursuit, these people would soon become objects of pity, not admiration (cf. 1 Cor. 15:19). No hope; no endeavor.

Fortunately, there is hope. The New Testament makes it emphatically clear that forgiveness of sins is possible (Matt. 26:28; Luke 24:47; Acts 2:38; Eph. 1:7); consequently, residing in heaven once this life is over is also possible (John 14:1-3; 1 Pet. 1:3-4). In fact, followers of Christ should harbor a confident expectation of living with God forever (Rom. 8:24-25; Col. 1:3-5; Heb. 6:17-20; 1 Thess. 4:13-18; 1 John 5:13). Though the scenario in the previous paragraph would be about as tragic as it gets, a couple of realities do exist that are just as horrific. Even though Christ offers hope to all (1 Tim. 2:4; Titus 2:11; 2 Pet. 3:9), not only are there people who are unaware of it or have outright rejected it (Eph. 2:12), but there are also those who at one time embraced this hope only to abandon it for one reason or another (Heb. 6:4-8; 2 Pet. 2:20-22). May the Lord help those of us who have hope to share it with those who currently have no hope (1 Pet. 3:15; James 5:19-20).

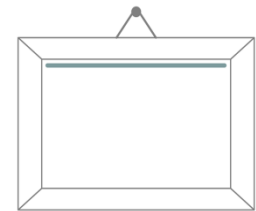

Do we ever cause God to want to send a "recall" on us? Do we threaten to hurt the image of the bride of Christ through our actions? Do we say things that reflect the church in a negative way? Is our performance less than desirable? If so, we might be deserving of a "recall."

Of course, God doesn't send out such a thing. He does, however give us ample opportunity to take care of any issues on our own! We may do well to ask ourselves this question: "Am I deserving of a spiritual recall?" If the answer is yes, let's do something about it!
