Inspiring Awe

When is the last time you sat back and meditated on the grandeur of God? For various reasons, we often lose sight of just how incredible God is. I am convinced that our eyes need to be frequently reopened to the greatness of God. One way to accomplish this is to bask in the wonders of God's creation (Gen. 1; Ps. 33:6-9; 135:1-9; Heb. 11:3).

Scripture itself upholds the idea that there are two sources of divine revelation. The Bible, of course, is one; creation is the other. In Psalm 19:1-3, we read: "The heavens declare the glory of God, and the sky above proclaims his handiwork. Day to day pours out speech, and night to night reveals knowledge. There is no speech, nor are there words, whose voice is not heard. Their voice goes out through all the earth, and their words to the end of the world" (cf. Rom. 1:19-20). God's people recognize that the reality of creation does, in fact, reveal the grandeur of God.

So, what might we point to in creation in an effort to inspire awe in our hearts? I have discovered that a consideration of the universe is one of the best ways to accomplish this.

- Our planet hurtles through space a total of 93,205,679 miles every single year. That's well over 255,000 miles a day or 10,625 miles per hour. What's more? Earth travels this distance every day while spinning at a rate of 1,000 miles per hour.
- If Jupiter were not in its current orbit, Earth would be bombarded with space material. It acts as a sort of cosmic vacuum cleaner on our behalf, preventing global havoc.
- The average distance between Earth and the sun is 93 million miles. It's amazing that we can even see the sun in our sky. This should give you an indication of how big the sun is. If that doesn't amaze you, think about the fact that it would take over one million Earths to fill up the sun.
- Our solar system is only the beginning of what is out there. The sun is a star, but it's not the only star. There are at least 100 billion stars in our galaxy alone. To give you an idea of how big our galaxy is, consider that it would take a spacecraft traveling at the speed of light (i.e. 186,000 miles per second) nearly 100,000 years to traverse our entire galaxy.

To this list you could obviously add so much more. In fact, I would suggest that you do some research on a particular image that the NASA guys refer to as the "Hubble Ultra Deep Field." Prepare to have your mind blown.

While the universe itself is awe-inspiring, it obviously doesn't hold a candle to the One who created it. In Isaiah 40:25-26, we read: "To whom then will you compare me, that I should be like him? says the Holy One. Lift up your eyes on high and see: who created these? He who brings out their host by number, calling them all by name, by the greatness of his might, and because he is strong in power not one is missing."

John Glenn was 77 years old when he got to fly with the Space Shuttle Discovery. He looked out the window of that shuttle at space, and he said, "To look out at this kind of creation and not to believe in God is, to me, impossible." That's true, but there's more. One can't look at that kind of creation and not be overwhelmed by the grandeur and glory of God.
