A Daily Endeavor

The engineer on the Norwegian-American liner Vistafjord had invited some passengers to visit the ship's bridge. After he explained the operations of the navigational equipment, one of his guests remarked that all the brass gleamed as if it were gold. "How often do you polish it?" the man inquired. "Every day," the engineer replied, "It starts to tarnish the minute you stop polishing it."

The engineer's comment is reminiscent of the self-appraisal made by the great pianist Ignacy Paderewski. Discussing the need for daily practice, he said that if he missed a day, he would notice the difference in his playing. If he missed several days, the critics would notice the difference. If a week went by without practice, the public would notice the difference.

Both the engineer and the pianist echo an emphasis that we find in Scripture about living for God on a daily basis:

- Like David, we should praise and give thanks to God every day (Ps. 145:2).
- Like Daniel, we should pray to God throughout every day (Dan. 6:10; cf. Ps. 88:9; 1 Thess. 5:17).
- Like the early church, we should encourage one another on a daily basis (Acts 2:46; Heb. 3:13).
- Like the Bereans, we should search the Scriptures daily (Acts 17:11; cf. Ps. 1:2).
- Like Paul, we should be willing to put our lives on the line for Jesus every day (1 Cor. 15:31).

Discipleship should obviously be viewed as a daily endeavor. If we want to become more like Christ and if we want our lives to be attractive testimonies for Him, we had better not be sporadic in following Him. After all, the One whom we are following said, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me" (Luke 9:23).
