Loving the Different Ones

How good are you at alienating yourself from others who are different from you? Does a person's race or ethnicity affect your willingness to love and serve him or her? What about a person's educational or economic status? What about a person's appearance (i.e. hair, clothing, tattoos)? What about a person's mannerisms? What if the person has certain quirks or idiosyncrasies that irk you? What if the person is just plain weird when compared to what you consider normal? What if the person has a particular handicap, mental disease, or emotional disorder? To what extent do you struggle to love, serve, and reach out to those who are different from you?

I don't know about you, but I find this line of questioning quite challenging. It can be difficult to connect to those who are different from us. It's much easier to surround ourselves with or welcome those whom we perceive to be like us in various ways. It's comfortable. It doesn't demand as much from us. Most people would arguably like to have the luxury of deciding who their neighbor is and who their neighbor is not. God, however, expects us to crawl out of our comfort zones to embrace, serve, and teach those who are different from us.

So, what do we need to know or do in order to overcome whatever anxieties or prejudices we may have? First of all, we must cultivate a heart that genuinely loves everyone. Echoing Leviticus 19:18, Jesus says, "Love your neighbor as yourself" (Matt. 22:39; cf. Rom. 13:8-10; Gal. 5:13-15; Jas. 2:8). Our neighbor is "everyman," even those whom we would not be inclined to consider our neighbor (Matt. 5:43-48; Luke 10:25-37).

Secondly, we must overcome the tendency to be discriminatory. God is impartial, not partial (Acts 10:34-35). Jesus exemplified such impartiality in His dealings with the Samaritan woman (John 4:1-26), and Christians must follow His example (1 Thess. 5:15; Gal. 2:11-14; 6:10; Jas. 2:1-7).

Third, we must approach others and treat others as we would want them to approach or treat us. When we fail to treat others—even those who are different from us—as we would like to be treated, we break the so-called Golden Rule (Matt. 7:12; Luke 6:31). No one wants to be alienated or mistreated. No one wants to be slighted or overlooked. No one desires to be prejudged or stereotyped. If we don't want to receive such treatment, then we should not give such treatment.

Fourth, we must realize that faithful people can come from any background or circumstance. Jesus reserved some of His greatest compliments for those we would least expect, such as a Canaanite woman (Matt. 15:21-28) and a Roman centurion (Luke 7:1-10). How unwise it would be for us to dismiss anyone out of hand based solely on the fact that he or she is different from us!

Throughout His ministry, Jesus had compassion on all people, no matter where they came from, what they looked like, or even how unsavory they may have appeared to the general public. In the end, Jesus did not die for a select few; He died for sinners, which encompasses all of humanity (Rom. 3:23). Moreover, Jesus has commanded His people to make disciples of all people, for all people are in need of Him (Matt. 28:18-20). Here's the bottom line: We have not been truly converted to Jesus Christ, if we are unwilling to love the different ones.



5th SUNDAY FELLOWSHIP MEAL AND SPECIAL BIRTHDAY!
