The Domino Effect

As a child, I never played dominos, but I played with dominos. There is something truly satisfying about setting dominos up in a long row or some elaborate design, tipping the first domino, and watching the chain reaction as each domino falls and topples the one next to it. Such depicts to some extent how one thought leads to another, how one act leads to another, how one decision continues to bear results, or how one person impacts another. A domino effect can be either positive or negative, and the Bible records its fair share of domino effects.

The first domino effect recorded in Scripture is found in Genesis 3. Satan tempted Eve, and then Eve deceived Adam (Gen. 3:1-6). A chain of consequences followed Adam and Eve's fall (Gen. 3:7-24). In fact, what transpired in the Garden of Eden continues to affect humanity today, not the least of which is physical death (Rom. 5:12). In a sense, the dominos that fell in the beginning started a chain reaction that continues in the present.

God, however, had in place a plan to reverse the curse of the first domino effect. In 1 Corinthians 15:12-19, we read of a hypothetical domino effect. The first domino in this instance is a crucified Christ who was not raised from the dead. In this passage, the apostle Paul highlights a chain of undesired consequences. If Christ has not been raised from the dead, then our preaching is pointless, our faith is futile, our souls are saturated with sin, our loved ones who died in Christ will remain buried, and our future is hopeless. If we must begin with a non-resurrected Christ, then we are all in trouble.

Fortunately, in 1 Corinthians 15:20, Paul emphatically states: "But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep." With this as our beginning point, the domino effect looks much different. Since Christ has been raised from the dead, our preaching is powerful, our faith is effective, our souls have been set free from sin, our loved ones who died in Christ will not stay buried, and our future is hopeful. Jesus can undo what Adam did for those who put their faith in Him (1 Cor. 15:21-22; cf. Rom. 5:12-21).

So I leave you with a challenge: The next time you go through the storms of life, remember to turn to God. Pray to Him. He will be there to guide you.
