Applications 1

Discuss what the students have found in their schoolbooks on evolution. Talk about temptation and consequences. (Adam and Eve) Discuss ways our worship might be unacceptable. (Cain and Abel's offering/worship.) Talk about jealousy and the lack of self-control when we are angry. Are we our brother's keeper? (Matt. 18:15; Matt. 25:40; Matt. 5:23-24.)

Enoch is one of only two men in the Bible who was taken to heaven without dying. He, like Noah (his great-grandson) was a preacher of righteousness. Enoch and Noah were the only two men stated in the Scriptures, who "walked with God." Lead the students in discussion, "How can we strive to walk with God?"

Show that by confusing their language, God's will was done (which was for the people to "scatter and replenish the earth"). We must always choose God's way rather than our own.

Do we really sacrifice for God? Discuss Isaac's submission to his father. Stress the importance Abraham and his servant placed on choosing a mate for Isaac. In God's sight, when did Isaac and Rebekah become man and wife? (24:67) Discuss purity.

Talk about deception and how it was revisited on Jacob. First by Laban, then later by his own sons.

Review the highlights of this story. Focus especially on having a good attitude, making the best of bad situations, fleeing temptation, and total forgiveness.

The first forty years of his life, the future liberator and leader of Israel grew up and was taught "in all the wisdom of the Egyptians" right under Pharoah's nose. But, there is no doubt, Moses' parents helped to shape his character. Discuss the faith of Amram and Jochebed—Heb.11:23, and the meaning of verses 24 and 25.

Moses worked in at least three very different careers. Member of the royal family-40 years, shepherd-40 years, leader of the Exodus-40 years. The first two-thirds were as preparation for the last third. He was eighty years old when God told him from the burning bush that he was to be the leader of Israel. We too, must allow God to use us to accomplish His purpose each day and each age of our life.

Applications

God's plan was fulfilled through the scriptures. Teach some of these prophecies concerning Jesus so their faith in the Word of God might grow. Also, tell how He left the splendor of heaven to such humble surroundings among the animals. He put Himself in that position for us.

As Christians we must keep our eyes on the goal and dare to be different from the world. Talk about John's focus in life. We should strive to have that kind of determination, zeal, and desire to "prepare the way" and lead others to Christ. Ask, "Do we exemplify humbleness in His presence as John did?" Could we have done as John did in the face of death or would we tend to "straddle the fence" to save our life?

Jesus, like us, faced real temptations. We should follow His example in overcoming them. We must hide His Word in our hearts to use as our defense.

Talk about miracles. Why Jesus performed miracles. Are there miracles today? Have them name miracles learned from the Old Testament and name other miracles that Jesus performed.

Like the blind man, we must have faith and works to be pleasing to God.

Stress that we are to be spiritual lights in a darkened world, and the Beatitudes. Discuss what is taught on adultery, divorce, flaunting charitable deeds, judging others and the Golden Rule.

ALL have sinned. ALL are unable to pay for their sins, but ALL may have their sins forgiven.

We must take time out for God's Word to take root within us. We must be grounded in the faith, grow, and be fruitful. Be on guard against Satan.

We grow in the church by studying the Bible, learning memory work, and faithful attendance.

Discuss ways we can develop a deeper, stronger faith.
