BE JOYFUL

Octavius Winslow, a preacher and prolific writer from the 19th century, once said: "What emotion in Christ's soul was deeper and superior to every other? What caused Him to long for the garments rolled in blood, to pant for His baptism of suffering, to press the cold earth of Gethsemane, to embrace the rude cross of Calvary, and to confront the serried ranks of His enemies in that final hour? Oh, it was this—'who for the JOY that was set before Him, endured the cross, despising the shame.' It was the joy of saving sinners—the joy of ransoming His church—the joy of supplanting earth's sin, and woe, and curse, with the holiness, the happiness, the joy of His Gospel. Identify yourself—your intellect, your wealth, your influence, your time—with this joy of your Lord!" Jesus' joy was not fleeting, a mere passing emotion. It abided in Him, even in the midst of persecution, suffering, and death (Heb. 12:1-3).

A third-century man who was anticipating his own death penned these last words to a friend: "It's a bad world, an incredibly bad world. But I have discovered in the midst of it a quiet and holy people who have learned a great secret. They have found a joy which is a thousand times better than any pleasure of our sinful life. They are despised and persecuted, but they care not. They are masters of their souls. They have overcome the world. These people are the Christians—and I am one of them." No matter their temporary afflictions or hardships, Christians should "greatly rejoice with joy inexpressible and full of glory" (1 Pet. 1:8). After all, joy is as much a part of the fruit of the Spirit as love is (Gal. 5:22). Christians should reflect in their own lives the joy that characterized their Lord and Savior.

But why, you might ask, should Christians be joyful? Well, among other things, on the horizon is the wedding of all weddings. The bride of all brides will be united forever with the groom of all grooms (cf. Eph. 5:25-27). The church is the bride of Christ (Rev. 21:9), and one day those who are a part of His church will be united with Him forever. "Rejoice and be glad," Jesus says, "for your reward in heaven is great" (Matt. 5:12).
