The Giving God

God is not a good giver; He's a great giver. In James 1:5, God is described as the one "who gives to all liberally and without reproach." God gives to all His people, not just a few. He gives generously, not frugally, reluctantly, or condescendingly. Later in this same chapter, James writes, "Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change" (vs. 17). Behind every good thing in our lives, we ought to see the Father.

God, our Father, is responsible for our very lives, for He is the one "who gives life to all things" (1 Tim. 6:13; cf. Acts 17:25). Because of His love for the world, God "gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life" (John 3:16; cf. Rom. 8:32; 2 Cor. 9:15). While God can be said to give us Jesus, the Bible also affirms that Jesus "gave Himself a ransom for all" (1 Tim. 2:5-6; cf. Mark 10:45; Gal. 1:3-4; 2:20; Eph. 5:25; Titus 2:14). Besides giving us Jesus, God also gives the Holy Spirit to those who surrender to Him (Acts 2:38; 5:32; Rom. 5:5; 1 John 3:4). Among other things, the Holy Spirit serves as a kind of "pledge" or "down payment" that God will fulfill His ultimate promises to His people (2 Cor. 1:21-22; 5:5; Eph. 1:13-14). Just as God is the giver of physical life, He is also the giver of eternal life (John 10:27-28; 1 John 5:11). Indeed, salvation is God's gift to mankind (Rom. 3:23-24; 6:23; Eph. 2:8-9).

Since God is such a great giver, it stands to reason that His people should be great givers as well (Eph. 5:1-2). For those of us who are Christians, to live is to give, and there's more to give than just our money. On Sunday nights, we are exploring various ways that we can reflect in our own lives the generosity of our giving God. Please consider joining us for this series of lessons. I promise that they will challenge and encourage you to be the best giver that you can be, and you should desire that. After all, Jesus said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35).
