SELFLESSNESS

C. S. Kirkendall, Jr. provides the following account: "Every young student knows of Isaac Newton's famed encounter with a falling apple. Newton discovered and introduced the laws of gravity in the 1600s, which revolutionized astronomical studies. But few know that if it weren't for Edmund Halley, the world might never have learned from Newton. It was Halley who challenged Newton to think through his original notions. Halley corrected Newton's mathematical errors and prepared geometrical figures to support his discoveries. Halley coaxed the hesitant Newton to write his great work *Mathematical Principles of Natural Philosophy*. Halley edited and supervised the publication, and he actually financed its printing even though Newton was wealthier and easily could have afforded the printing costs."

Kirkendall continues with the following observations: "Historians call it one of the most selfless examples in the annals of science. Newton began almost immediately to reap the rewards of prominence; Halley received little credit. Halley did use the principles to predict the orbit and return of the comet that would later bear his name, but only after his death did he receive any acclaim. And because the comet only returns every seventy-six years, the notice is rather infrequent. Halley remained a devoted scientist who didn't care who received the credit as long as the cause was being advanced."

Several important questions surface at this point for those of us who claim to follow Jesus: Are you in Christianity solely for yourself or for the cause? Are you looking for personal glory, or are you looking to bring glory to God? Are you looking out only for yourself, or are you looking to advance the cause of Christ throughout your network of family and friends? Are you in it to receive certain accolades? Do you desire the praise and adoration of others, or do you seek the interests of others above your own? To put it simply, are you selfless or selfish?

In discipleship, selflessness should reign supreme. Visions of power, position, prominence, and popularity have no place in the mind of a disciple of Christ (Matt. 20:20-28; Mark 10:35-45). Though difficult, self-denial is expected (Mark 8:34-38; Luke 9:23-26). After all, God can't use selfish people. We've got to move ourselves out of the way, so that He can take control of our lives. Consider also who it is that we are following. What greater example of selflessness is there than Jesus of Nazareth (John 13:1-17; 2 Cor. 8:9; Phil 2:5-11)?
