And he that sat upon the throne said, Behold, I make all things new. And he said unto me, Write: for these words are true and beautiful (Rev 21:5).

These words are found near the end of the Bible, seeming to enfold and reaffirm the joyous theme of perpetual newness throughout the scriptures – from Genesis through Revelation. As we begin the new year of our Lord, 2017, Christians find comfort, peace, and great joy in knowing that:

- We get to sing a new song unto the Lord

Closing it out...

If you were to open one of our hymn books at Pulaski Street to song number seven, you would find "Abide With Me" by Henry Francis Lyte. This hymn, which he penned in 1847, has a powerful message of a deep need for God's presence; it is beautiful both lyrically and musically.

Lyte's hometown of Lower Brixham, Devonshire, England was known for having damp winters, and the lung condition that Lyte suffered with was done no favors by this. He had planned to travel to Italy for therapeutic reasons in the fall of 1847. He departed for Italy, yet neither made it to his destination, nor did he return home. Lyte passed away at a hotel in Nice, France on November 20th, 1847, days after sending the final arrangement of "Abide With Me" to his wife, Anne. According to history, the first time this song was ever sung was at the funeral of its author, Henry Lyte.

Considering his circumstances, the theme of this hymn, a desperate need for the presence and comfort of God, must have very much been on the mind of Henry Lyte throughout his final days, and I would imagine that many others since him have thought of the lyrics of this hymn as their final days were upon them. But, if we would consider the plea of this hymn each day of our lives, I believe we would be better for it. In closing, consider the third verse of this song.

"I need Thy presence every passing hour. What but Thy grace can foil the tempter's power? Who, like Thyself, my guide and stay can be? Through cloud and sunshine, Lord, abide with me."
