The Boundary of Baptism

The subject of baptism has been an important focus in my preaching and teaching. On numerous occasions, I have tried to demonstrate that baptism, or the immersion of a penitent believer in water, is essential or necessary for salvation. In other words, I believe that baptism should be viewed as an essential one-time act that constitutes the moment of an individual's salvation and his/her initiation into the body of Christ. I affirm this because I accept the plain, simple, straightforward, and natural meaning of a host of baptismal passages in the New Testament (Matt. 28:18-20; Mark 16:15-16; Acts 2:37-41; 22:16; Rom. 6:1-6; Gal. 3:26-27; Col. 2:12; 1 Pet. 3:21). Consequently, over and against other faith groups, I contend that baptism should not be viewed as something that is disconnected from or subsequent to an individual's initial salvation. I unashamedly espouse a strong baptismal theology.

One's baptismal theology has profound implications with respect to the issue of fellowship. In his book *Theology for the Community of God*, Stanley Grenz insightfully observes, "A weak baptismal theology is ecumenically advantageous, in that it allows persons who practice baptism differently to affirm one another as Christians sharing the same Spirit" (428). Of course, the converse is also true: a strong baptismal theology is ecumenically disadvantageous. In other words, people, like myself, who view baptism as necessary for salvation and incorporation into Christ's church unavoidably cut themselves off from an extremely large group of people who have disconnected baptism from salvation.

A growing number of people have been abandoning a strong baptismal theology for a weak one. I can't help but think that one of the motives is the desire to be more ecumenical. Given my understanding of baptism, I cannot, in good conscience, fellowship those who do not embrace a strong baptismal theology. In my judgment, such constitutes an important "boundary" that should not be moved, neglected, replaced, or discarded.
