**Hypocrisy**

The Queen Mary was the largest ship to cross the oceans when it was launched in 1936. Through four decades and a World War, she served until she was retired and anchored as a floating hotel and museum in Long Beach, California. During this conversion, her three massive smokestacks were taken off to be scraped down and repainted. But on the dock they crumbled. Nothing was left of the three-fourths of an inch steel plate from which the stacks had been formed. All that remained were more than thirty coats of paint that had been applied over the years. The steel, the stacks' true substance, had rusted away.

Many of the Pharisees in Jesus' day were like those smokestacks. They were cups that were clean on the outside but nasty on the inside (Matt. 23:25). They were tombs that were white on the outside but disgusting on the inside (Matt. 23:27). They had no true substance to their religion, only an external appearance. In a word, they were hypocrites.

Hypocrisy can raise its ugly head in a number of ways. Some talk spiritually and act righteously when they are around other Christians; however, when they are away from fellow Christians, they consistently behave in ungodly ways (cf. Titus 1:16). Some act religious just to impress others who have religious values rather than to please God (Matt. 6:1-6, 16-18; 23:5, 14). Others conceive of church involvement as nothing more than a means to receive applause or achieve prestige and status (Matt. 23:6-7; Phil. 1:15-17). Some even work their way into the good graces of a local congregation in order to fleece the people. They are freeloaders who only want to be supported financially and materially (John 6:26; 1 Tim. 6:5). Then, there are those who become Christians and attend services and join in performing good works only to please their families and friends. Still others have succumbed to the idea that they are perfect, having attained the peak of self-righteousness (Luke 18:11-12). They are void of humility, asserting (many times unconsciously) that they don't need God.

In reflecting back on all these ways in which hypocrisy can manifest itself, there is one thing that brings them all together: deception. Hypocrites might fool others and even themselves (e.g. the self-righteous), but they aren't going to fool God. God sees them play-acting on that stage. He sees their pretenses and motives. He sees their true intent. He sees that they really do not care about Him or His cause. He sees the major disconnection between their talk and walk. These kinds of performances do not amuse God. In fact, if a hypocrite does not repent, stop playing around, and clean up what's on the inside, he or she will end up where hypocrites end up: a place where there's weeping and gnashing of teeth (Matt. 24:50-51). Are you a hypocrite?
