Faith and Baptism

Many Roman Catholic theologians uphold the doctrine of “baptismal regeneration.” According to this teaching, the act of baptism or the baptismal water itself conveys a divine cleansing of the soul separate and apart from appropriate knowledge, genuine faith, and sincere penitence on the part of the one being baptized. I’ve had people attempt to classify my teaching on baptism as “baptismal regeneration,” but such could not be further from the truth.

In Colossians 2:12, the apostle Paul implies that baptism is worthless without faith. He tells the Christians at Colossae that the salvific effect of baptism is accomplished “through faith in the powerful working of God.” As Jack Cottrell says, “The sinner enters the baptismal waters with ‘faith in the working of God’ in his heart (Col. 2:12), trusting that God will at that moment keep his promises to bestow forgiveness . . .” (*The Faith Once for All* 372-73). A faithless baptism is futile and does not result in the removal of transgressions.

Colossians 2:12 also undercuts the objection of many evangelicals who argue that to speak of baptism as something that is essential to salvation implies that a person is saved by “works” and not by faith (cf. Eph. 2:8-9). If anything, this verse reminds us that the work that is performed in baptism is a work of God, not a “work” in the meritorious sense on the part of man. In baptism, a penitent believer exercises his or her faith, trusting that God will accomplish in the act of baptism what He has promised to accomplish, namely, the forgiveness of sins.

So, please don’t think for a minute that I have a magical view of water, and don’t think for a minute that I believe water in itself has the power to save me. What I’m saying about baptism is that it is the time and place God has promised to meet penitent believers and graciously wash their sins away. Of course, the ultimate reason God can and will graciously forgive us of our sins in baptism is because of the substitutionary sacrifice of his Son, Jesus Christ. Without the atonement of Christ, not only would baptism be pointless, but faith would be as well.

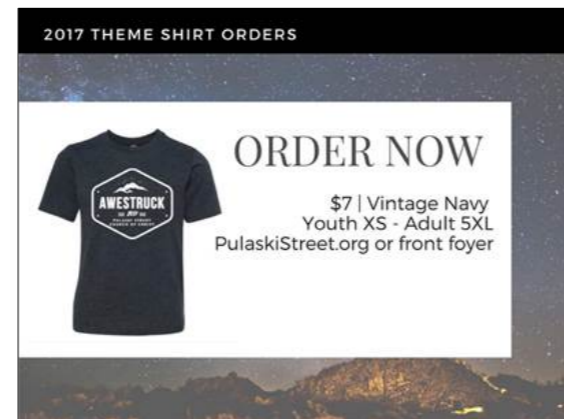
