Accepting God's Pardon

A preacher by the name of Blaine Hescht once wrote: "When we work a forty-hour week and receive a fair week's pay for our time, that is a wage. When we compete in athletics and receive a trophy for our performance, that is a prize. When we receive recognition for long service or high achievements in business, that is an award. When we are incapable of earning a wage, can win no prize, and deserve no award—yet receive a gift anyway—that is grace."

Grace is most certainly a free gift, and grace is the foundation and source of our salvation (Rom. 3:23-26; 6:23b). It's not principally about what we've done; it's about what God has done in and through Jesus Christ (Eph. 2:8-9; Titus 3:4-5). But while salvation is by all means free, it is by no means unconditional. Grace is a gift that must be accepted, and like any other gift, it can be refused.

In 1830, George Wilson was arrested for mail theft and sentenced to be hanged. President Andrew Jackson eventually gave him a pardon, but he refused to accept it. The authorities were puzzled. Should Wilson be freed or hanged? They consulted Chief Justice John Marshall, who handed down this decision: "A pardon is a slip of paper, the value of which is determined by the acceptance of the person to be pardoned. If it is refused, it is no pardon. George Wilson must be hanged."

Similarly, God has offered to pardon everyone (1 Tim. 2:4; Titus 2:11; 2 Pet. 3:9). Jesus died for everyone (1 John 2:2), but not everyone is going to heaven (Matt. 7:13-14). Why? Because this pardon must be accepted, and not everyone accepts the pardon. Certain conditions have to be met in order to receive God's pardon. These conditions are not conditions that we set; they are conditions that God sets. We don't come to God on our terms; we come to God on His terms.

In order to receive God's pardon, we are asked to meet the following conditions: (1) believe in God's Son and trust His sacrifice (John 8:24; 20:30-31; Rom. 3:21-26); (2) repent of our sins that put God's Son on the cross (Acts 2:38; 17:30-31; 2 Pet. 3:9); (3) confess God's Son (Matt. 16:16; Rom. 10:10; 1 Tim. 6:12); (4) be immersed in water for the forgiveness of sins, reenacting the death, burial, and resurrection of God's Son (Acts 2:38; 22:16; Rom. 6:1-6; Gal. 3:26-27; Col. 2:11-14; 1 Pet. 3:21). We accept God's gracious pardon by meeting these conditions. Have you done so? If so, wonderful! If not, let's talk.
