The Promise Keeper

God doesn't just make promises; He keeps them. One of the overarching messages of the Bible is that God is faithful and that He can be trusted . . . no matter what. Whatever He promises He will bring to pass, because it is impossible for Him to lie (Num. 23:19; Rom. 3:4; Titus 1:1-2; Heb. 6:13-20). Noah, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Moses, and David—just to name a few—can all attest to the promise-keeping proficiency of God.

The promises that God has kept and will keep are not mediocre. They are huge and weighty. Peter described God's promises as "precious and very great" (2 Pet. 1:4). God kept His promise of blessing all the nations of the world through the seed of Abraham, i.e. Jesus Christ (Gen. 12:1-3; Gal. 3:15-29). Making and keeping that promise was hardly pedestrian. Accordingly, God will keep His promises of forgiving our sin (1 John 1:5-10), sending Jesus a second time (Heb. 9:27-28; 2 Pet. 3:3-10), resurrecting and glorifying our bodies (John 5:28-29; Rom. 8:23; 1 Cor. 15; Phil. 3:21), and providing us with an eternal inheritance (John 14:1-4; Heb. 9:15; 2 Pet. 3:13).

It is absolutely vital that we maintain a relentless trust in God's promises. In John Bunyan's extended allegory entitled *Pilgrim's Progress*, there is a passage where the characters Christian and Hopeful are trapped in Doubting Castle as prisoners of Giant Despair. They are eventually able to escape only because Hopeful remembers that he has the Key of Promise that unlocks the dungeon door. Bunyan's remarks after this episode are insightful: "Precious promise! The promises of God in Christ are the life of faith and the quickeners of prayer. Oh how oft we do neglect God's great and precious promises in Christ Jesus, while doubts and despair keep us prisoners."

"Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful."
Hebrews 10:23
