BUT GOD

In most English Bible translations, you will find the above two words together about forty times. In some contexts, it simply communicates a contrast, but in most contexts, it launches God into the limelight. Take the time to consider the following verses of Scripture in their narrative or immediate context and discover for yourself the significance of each one:

- Genesis 8:1, "**But God** remembered Noah and all the beasts and all the livestock that were with him in the ark."
- Genesis 45:8, "So it was not you who sent me here, **but God**."
- Genesis 50:20, "As for you, you meant evil against me, **but God** meant it for good, to bring it about that many people should be kept alive, as they are today."
- 1 Samuel 23:14, "And David remained in the strongholds in the wilderness, in the hill country of the wilderness of Ziph. And Saul sought him every day, **but God** did not give him into his hand."
- 2 Samuel 14:14, "We must all die; we are like water spilled on the ground, which cannot be gathered up again. **But God** will not take away life, and he devises means so that the banished one will not remain an outcast."
- Psalm 49:15, "**But God** will ransom my soul from the power of Sheol, for he will receive me."
- Psalm 73:26, "My heart and my flesh may fail, **but God** is the strength of my heart and my portion forever."
- Mark 2:7, "Why does this man speak like that? He is blaspheming! Who can forgive sins **but God** alone?"
- Acts 10:28, "And he said to them, 'You yourselves know how unlawful it is for a Jew to associate with or to visit anyone of another nation, **but God** has shown me that I should not call any person common or unclean.'"
- Acts 10:39b-40, "They put him to death by hanging him on a tree, **but God** raised him on the third day . . ."
- Romans 5:7-8, "For one will scarcely die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person one would dare even to die—**but God** shows his love for us in while we were still sinners, Christ died for us."
- 1 Corinthians 1:27, "**But God** chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong . . ."
- 1 Corinthians 3:6, "I planted, Apollos watered, **but God** gave the growth."
- Galatians 3:18, "For if the inheritance comes by the law, it no longer comes by promise; **but God** gave it to Abraham by a promise."
- Ephesians 2:4, "**But God**, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ . . ."

That's an impressive list, isn't it? It's rich. It's powerful. That two-word phrase underscores the fact that we would be a hopeless people if it weren't for God. Indeed, one could argue that "but God" is a succinct summary of the good news that Christians are called to proclaim to the world.
