The Brown Chicken

The first son gave her a huge mansion in which to live, while the second son gave her a Mercedes. The third son, though, gave her a brown parrot. Now, this was not just any old parrot. As a matter of fact, it was a rather expensive parrot—\$250,000 to be exact. “Why so expensive?” you might ask. Well, believe it or not, this parrot had the entire Bible memorized. You see, this mother used to love reading her Bible before her eyesight got so bad that she couldn’t see the words on the page anymore. So, her youngest son bought her a parrot that could quote any verse of the Bible. All she had to do was give the book, chapter, and verse, and the parrot would immediately recite the appropriate passage. Incredible!

Shortly after receiving these gifts, the mother wrote the third son a letter to thank him for his gift. In it, she told him about the other gifts she had received. The first son, she said, gave her a mansion. Of course, she only used a couple of the rooms, and she didn’t have the energy to keep the rest of the house clean. The second son gave her a Mercedes. Though nice, she didn’t really have anywhere to go, and the driver was bored stiff and just sat around all day. Ahh, but she loved the gift her youngest son gave her. She said, “Son, I want you to know that that brown chicken you gave me was absolutely delicious.”

Wouldn’t it be a shame if that were true? She took a gift worth \$250,000 that could literally speak the word of God and she ate it. Though fictitious, we would all agree what a waste of a perfectly good gift that would be.

Now, our God whom we love and who loves us has given various gifts to His children (Rom. 12:3-8). Everyone has been given at least one gift by God that is to be used in furthering His kingdom (1 Pet. 4:10-11). There’s not an exception. What if we just decided to eat that gift? What if we just decided to waste it? What if we used it to promote ourselves rather than God? What if we used it to enrich ourselves but not others? If we are not using the gifts that God has given us to glorify Him, to build up our brothers and sisters in Christ, and to bring others to Him, then we have wasted those gifts. To learn that you have consumed a \$250,000 brown parrot who can recite the entire Bible would be hard to stomach, but nothing is worse than squandering those gifts God has given us to exalt Him and bless others.
