Be Humble or Be Humbled

A young college graduate was asked to speak at a small congregation. He was prepared and poised to impress God's people. His self-confidence was equaled only by his smugness. After his introduction, he started into his sermon, quoting his sources and citing multiple passages from memory. The congregation, however, looked perplexed at his points and couldn't understand exactly what he was trying to say. After realizing that even the main point of his sermon was not even being understood, he began stammering and stuttering. His frustration turned into fear and then into panic. He ended up stopping short of his conclusion and apologized to the people while slowly coming down to sit on the front row next to the older preacher. The preacher leaned over and said, "If you had gone up like you came down, you could have come down like you went up."

With those words, the older preacher eloquently echoed the teaching of Jesus. On one occasion, Jesus told a parable about a Pharisee and a publican (Luke 18:9-14). Both the Pharisee and the publican went to the temple to pray, but their prayers couldn't have been more different. The Pharisee arrogantly reveled in his accomplishments and even displayed a repulsive disregard for the publican, a potential follower of God. The publican, in stark contrast, manifested shame. He wouldn't even lift his eyes up to heaven, and while beating his chest, he prayed, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner!" After relating to His self-righteous audience that it was the publican, not the Pharisee, who went down to his house justified, Jesus solemnly proclaimed, "For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted" (Luke 18:14b).

I think it would be in our best interest to take Jesus' words here seriously. It's a word of warning and a word of comfort. Those who are arrogant, prideful, and self-righteous will be brought low. Those who are modest, humble, and dependent on God will be raised high. Be humble or be humbled. You've got a choice. Choose wisely.
