Tough Issues

On Sunday evenings at 6:00 p.m., beginning this Sunday, February 4, 2018, I plan to present a series of lessons on some tough issues. Below is a preview of what's to come:

February 4 AbortionFebruary 11 Suicide

February 18 Drug and Alcohol Addiction

Since our worship service after lunch on fourth Sundays mainly consists of singing with a sermonette toward the end, I will be taking a hiatus from this series on February 25 and March 25.

Several reasons exist as to why we might identify these as tough issues. First, most of these issues evoke strong emotions. Emotions can make it difficult for a person to pay attention to what's being said. If you've lost a loved one to suicide, then listening to a sermon on suicide isn't easy. Emotions can also prevent a person from either accepting what the Bible teaches on one of these issues or enacting what God would want an individual to do in a given situation. Much like Jesus' disciples, countless couples have balked at Jesus' teaching about divorce and remarriage (cf. Matt. 19:9-10). Moreover, due to a strong aversion to certain lifestyles, some people have been guilty of hating the sinner, not just the sin.

Second, some of the issues listed above are not explicitly mentioned or discussed in the Bible. For instance, transgenderism and even abortion are not addressed by name in the Bible. To be sure, various principles abound in Scripture that help us determine what God wants us to believe and practice regarding these and many other issues, but there are certain areas of inquiry that have occasioned some sharp disagreement among Christians. What if a mother aborts her baby in order to save her own life? What if a man took his own life because he suffered from a mental illness? If a man and woman have no right to be married in God's eyes, should they get a divorce and live in different homes (even if children are involved), or should they revert to a platonic relationship and remain under the same roof? Should same-sex attraction be considered sinful in and of itself?

Third, a study of these issues sometimes requires consulting other sources besides the Bible. For instance, what we know about how addiction affects the brain does not come from the Bible but from medical journals, which are based on the testimony and study of addicts. Such studies have also been indispensable in creating effective treatments for addicts. Nevertheless, the information available from medical and psychological specialists about a given issue is overwhelming and sometimes contradictory. This can complicate matters considerably, especially for preachers like me who desire to create accurate and informed presentations.

Fourth, how Christians have traditionally viewed some of these issues is not shared by a sizable segment of our society. As I'm sure you are aware, Christians have been demonized in recent years for not accepting homosexuality as a legitimate alternative lifestyle. Furthermore, discussing some of these issues has been made all the more difficult because they have been politicized.

In this series on tough issues, I am not interested in pushing anyone's agenda, except God's. I don't want to be guilty of putting words into God's mouth, nor do I want to be guilty of apologizing for God. Parents, I also promise to be discreet. There are some conversations that you're probably not ready to have with your little ones just yet. Please pray for my preparation, and please resolve to be gracious toward me when you find yourself disagreeing with something I've said. I always welcome a constructive dialogue.
