No Substitute for Obedience

Many people today are not really enthusiastic about submitting to authority. This is played out in both the secular and religious world. There are a host of people who rebel and refuse to comply with the laws of the land. Unfortunately, there are also professing Christians who fail to comply with the laws of the one, true God. *It is an obedience problem*—plain and simple. For our purposes, we need to recognize that God, who is the ultimate authority, expects those who would follow Him to comply with His commands (Deut. 11:26-28; 13:4; 30:2; John 14:15; 15:10; Acts 5:29; 1 John 5:3). In God’s mind, there is no substitute for obedience.

On the heels of a significant question concerning authority, Jesus relates a parable about two sons (Matt. 21:28-32). A father approaches his two sons at different times with the same question: “Son, go to work today in the vineyard” (vv. 28, 30). The first son replies, “I will not,” yet the text says that he later regretted his decision, so he went to the vineyard, thereby complying with his father’s command (vs. 29). The second son replies, “I will sir,” but the text says he never went to the vineyard (vs. 30). Upon completing this short parable, Jesus asked, “Which of the two sons did the will of the father?” Those gathered around Jesus pointed out that it was the first son who obeyed (vs. 31). This parable brings to light a very important consideration: *Mere words do not constitute obedience*. Elsewhere, this same sentiment was expressed by Jesus in this way: “Not everyone who says to me, ‘Lord, Lord,’ will enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father who is in heaven will enter” (Matt. 7:21). Indeed, there is more to obedience than just a verbal profession.

Moreover, in John 5:39-40, Jesus says, “You search the Scriptures because you think that in them you have eternal life; it is these that testify about Me; and you are unwilling to come to Me so that you may have life.” Many Jews thought they could have life in knowing the Scriptures as opposed to coming to Jesus and submitting to Him. This brings to the forefront another important consideration: *Mere knowledge does not constitute obedience*. You can know what you must do to be saved, but if you do not act on what you know, you cannot be saved. Clearly, there is more to obedience than just knowledge of what you must do. Obedience implies action.

In the final analysis, we must understand that nothing in this world can be substituted for obedience. What God commands, we must do, not just simply talk about it or think about it. In fact, our faith is useless without obedience (Luke 6:46-49; James 1:22-25; 2:14-26; Heb. 11), and we know that without an obedient faith, we will be lost eternally (Rom. 1:5; 16:26; Heb. 5:8-9; 11:6).
