**The Embodiment of Authentic Spirituality**

Many people, including some Christians, have become confused about what it means to be spiritual. The word “spirituality” has morphed into a comprehensive term that is suggestive of anything that is beyond, more, or deep. There seem to be as many different definitions of spirituality as there are different people and different sources of information. So, how does one go about infusing this concept with meaning? More specifically, how are Christians to know what authentic spirituality looks like when the world presents them with a portrait of spirituality that is blurry and bewildering?

The answer to this question is found in Jesus. Being God in the flesh (John 1:14; 14:8-9), Jesus was the embodiment of authentic spirituality. If Christians want to know what authentic spirituality looks like, all they have to do is take a long, concentrated look at Jesus.

*Jesus’ spirituality was inextricably bound to an ongoing, living, and personal relationship with God the Father* (John 5:38; 10:30; cf. Matt. 22:37-38). He prayed to the Father (Mark 1:35; 6:46; 14:35). He read and reflected on His Father’s words (Luke 2:46-47; 4:1-13, 18-21; 24:27, 44-45). He worshiped the Father (Matt. 26:30; cf. John 4:21-24). For Jesus, spirituality was more than just the latest fad. It was a lifestyle that was connected to a dynamic relationship with God. Though we marvel at Jesus’ sincerity and devotion in all these aspects, there was nothing grandiose in the way that He related to His Father. All these expressions are available today, but for these expressions to have any meaning or vitality whatsoever, the heart has to be in it.

*Jesus’ spirituality found expression in teaching and serving others* (Mark 1:32-39; Matt. 4:23—7:29; 20:28; cf. Acts 10:36-38). His spirituality was not practiced in other-worldly isolation. The relationship that He enjoyed with the Father was something that He wanted others to experience as well. He taught, helped, and healed others, sometimes even to the point of exhaustion. In Jesus, we meet face to face with the fact that true spirituality, in many respects, is other-oriented and practical in nature (Matt. 22:39).

*Jesus’ spirituality did not prevent Him from being true-to-life and down-to-earth.* Some have stereotyped Christian spirituality as grim, stoic, and hopelessly disconnected from real life. Yet, in Jesus, we see quite the opposite. Jesus didn’t worry about appearing unspiritual when he accepted an invitation to a wedding (John 2:1-12). The Stoics of old may have been proud of hiding their emotions, but Jesus didn’t conceal his emotions (John 2:13-17; 11:35; Mark 14:32-35). Jesus didn’t think it was unspiritual for him to share his physical needs (John 4:7). Jesus, the most spiritual person to ever walk the face of this earth, was involved in the complexities of everyday life, so much so that the religious leaders of his day accused him of being anything but spiritual (cf. Luke 7:34).

In Jesus, we see what spirituality is supposed to look like. It is a way of life that is connected to a vibrant relationship with God. Rather than being mystical, it is practical and realistic, and it is worked out in and under the conditions of our humanity. There are many people today who want spirituality without Jesus, but spirituality without Jesus quickly degenerates into a sloppy subjectivism, tempting people to invent or customize their own version of spirituality. If we are to maintain an accurate understanding and practice of authentic spirituality, we need to keep Jesus ever in view.
