Are You Involved?

Those who have given themselves to Christ have pledged their lives for service in His kingdom. One of the Christian's primary responsibilities is being involved not just in the worship but also the work of a local congregation (Acts 2:42-47; Rom. 12:3-8; 1 Cor. 12:12-26). In fact, each Christian has a least one gift or ability that he or she can employ in service to others (1 Pet. 4:10-11; Matt. 25:14-30). Unfortunately, one too many Christians have become spectators rather than participators, and this means that one too many congregations are handicapped. There are no good reasons for healthy, able-bodied Christians not being involved in a local congregation in some capacity, but there are plenty of bad ones: indifference, worldliness, selfishness, and laziness.

Obviously, in order for Christians to be able to serve effectively, they must not only be equipped for service (Eph. 4:11-16), but they must also be provided with opportunities to serve. If a congregation's shepherds are not making opportunities available for each sheep to serve, they are failing the flock. Nevertheless, most congregations have more than enough work available for their members: teaching classes; serving in public worship; providing security during assemblies; visiting, calling, or writing the sick or the shut-in; preparing meals for the sick or bereaved; meeting various needs that arise among the members; reaching out to the community; supporting evangelistic or foreign mission efforts, etc. The problem in most congregations is not a scarcity of work but a scarcity of workers. The minority ends up doing the majority of the work.

For a Christian, meaningful involvement in a local congregation is not optional. First, it's *commanded* (see above passages). God expects every Christian to become a functioning part of Christ's body in a given locality. Second, it's *Christ-like*. Christ came to serve, not to be served (Matt. 10:45). Those who refuse to serve in one way or another ought to feel uncomfortable wearing the name "Christian." Third, it's *considerate*. Rather than expecting others to carry all the burdens, Christians should desire to share those burdens. The minority shouldn't have to do the majority of the work. If the majority were involved, then that would minimize the work for everyone involved. Are you involved? If not, then isn't it high time to get involved?


