Growing Out

Without question, Jesus expects a congregation of His people to grow out (i.e. numerical) and grow up (i.e. spiritual) no matter how old it is or where it is located (cf. Matt. 13:31-32; 28:18-20). Below are four principles for growing out (and up) in the days, months, and years ahead.

Pray Continually. No church will grow out if it does not rely on God, and going to God in prayer demonstrates one's reliance on Him. Christians should be praying for the growth of their respective congregations. According to Paul, it is God who ultimately gives the growth (1 Cor. 3:7). Yes, we all have our part to play in cultivating the soil and sowing seeds, but no church is going to grow and continue to grow if it does not trust God to do His part.

Avoid Gimmicks. Some churches do all sorts of crazy, questionable stuff to bring in the masses. Their methods are often indistinguishable from the marketing strategies of most secular businesses. In order to increase or maintain numbers, not a few churches have fallen into the trap of entertaining their people rather than bringing them under the lordship of Christ. Christians should not be opposed to gaining an audience in legitimate ways, but folks need to be confronted with the truth of the gospel. A decision for or against Christ has to be made. While God certainly desires quantity (2 Tim. 2:4; 2 Pet. 3:9), He also wants quality (John 6:25-66).

Stay Biblical. God has given us His Word for a reason. It is the Bible that is to be studied (2 Tim. 2:15). It is the Bible that is to be taught and preached (2 Tim. 3:16—4:4). It is God's voice that needs to be heard. In the minds of many, even some professing Christians, the Bible is outdated, irrelevant, and powerless. As such, many congregations have sent the Bible to the backburner, using all kinds of other sources as the basis for their preaching and teaching. However, there is no substitute for letting the biblical text do the talking. A legitimate conversion and relationship with God can only be facilitated through an understanding of and submission to God's will as revealed and communicated in Scripture.

Befriend All People. God is not a respecter of persons (Acts 10:34-35); consequently, Christians should not be either. Some Christians are only committed to loving and befriending those people who talk like them, dress like them, look like them, or make the same amount of money as them. Too often, the rich turn their noses up at the poor, while the poor turn their noses up at the rich. This is not the way it should be (James 2:1-9). Loving your neighbor as yourself means loving people without discrimination (Luke 10:25-37). Every soul is precious in God's sight and is in need of saving.
