Three Undeniable Biblical Facts

God wants everyone to be saved. In 1 Timothy 2:4, Paul describes God as the one “who desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth.” Peter makes a similar statement: “The Lord is not slow to fulfill his promise as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance” (2 Pet. 3:9). God wants everyone to be saved. God doesn’t want anyone to perish, i.e., to be separated from Him for an eternity. God wants everyone to repent.

God sent His Son into the world to be the atoning sacrifice for the sins of the whole world. In 1 John 2:2, John states that “[Jesus Christ] is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world.” Notice that Jesus didn’t die for a predestined few, but for everyone. Like John, Paul also highlights the universal significance of Jesus’ gracious sacrifice: “For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation for all people . . .” (Titus 2:11). Jesus didn’t bring salvation to a chosen few; He made it available to everyone.

Not everyone will be saved. In Matthew 7:13-14, Jesus proclaims, “Enter by the narrow gate. For the gate is wide and the way is easy that leads to destruction, and those who enter by it are many. For the gate is narrow and the way is hard that leads to life, and those who find it are few.” Yes, God wants everyone to be saved. Yes, Jesus died so that anyone could be saved. But, not everyone will be saved.

When combined, these three facts indicate that there must be something a person must do to receive salvation. Something is required from a man or woman in order to receive the gift of salvation that God offers through Jesus Christ. If there were nothing a person had to do to receive salvation, then no one would be lost (i.e. universalism), unless, of course, one did the really foolish thing and posited that God arbitrarily determines who will be lost (i.e. Calvinism). The third fact above undermines universalism, and the second one contradicts Calvinism.

Now, because we must do something to be saved does not suggest that we are able to earn our salvation. No amount of work or good deeds on our part could ever merit the salvation that God offers us. Salvation is not a thing to be earned; it is a gift to be received (Rom. 3:24; Eph. 2:8-9). The cause, source, ground, or basis of salvation is God’s grace in Jesus Christ. Without Christ’s sacrifice and subsequent resurrection, there is no salvation for anyone (Heb. 9:11—10:18; 1 Cor. 15:17). Nevertheless, the means of receiving God’s gracious gift of salvation is our faith, and biblical faith involves our belief and trust in Christ (John 8:24; 20:20-31; Rom. 3:23-25; Heb. 11:6) as well as our obedience to Christ (John 3:36; Acts 2:38; 22:16; Rom. 6:1-6, 17-18; 10:9-10; Heb. 5:8-9).

God wants you to be saved. Jesus has made it possible for you to be saved. It’s up to you whether you will be saved. If you need to talk, I’m here for you.
