You Are the One that We Praise

Do you like to sing? I hope so, because it is something we are called to do as true worshippers of our Lord. All throughout the New Testament, we see examples of the first century church gathering to sing praises, as we are commanded. This summer, the members of the Wednesday night high school class have been studying devotional songs, their histories, and the meanings behind them.

One song we have studied is “Wonderful, Merciful Savior” by Dawn Rodgers and Eric Wyse. This song describes many attributes of God that we often take for granted. We examined each verse, considering the adjectives used to describe God. The first words, “Wonderful, Merciful Savior,” direct our thoughts to some of the reasons we should praise Him. He is so much greater and so much more wonderful than we can comprehend, and He is so much more merciful than we could ever be. His mercy is so great that God the Son became flesh to be our Savior, becoming a sacrifice for the world.

“Counselor, Comforter, Keeper” is the phrase that begins the next verse. These names describe some of the things God does for us when we accept the gift of his sin-ending sacrifice. Isaiah 9:6 and 2 Corinthians 1:3-4 assure us of God’s powerful counsel and His comforting nature. The next words, “Spirit we long to embrace,” describe our relationship with God. We took time in class to question whether our hearts truly are longing to embrace God. Through the words of the song, we see that God’s response to us is always continued hope, even to those who have lost the way.

The last verse of the song praises elements of God’s nature that we may not always be able to understand. The third and final verse begins with the phrase “Almighty, Infinite Father.” The ending verse describes One who, though so high and mighty, is still our Father. He is a Father who faithfully loves His own, and, even in our weakness, He always finds us falling at His throne.

I hope this week we will reflect on who God is, who we are to Him, and how He wants us to respect Him. Never forget our wonderful, merciful Savior.
