Doing Good

Have you ever noticed that one of the main themes in Paul's letter to Titus is accomplishing or doing "good works"? Allow me to walk you briskly through the letter of Titus chapter by chapter, calling your attention to all the places where this idea of "good work" or "good works" occurs. It would probably be best if you followed along with me in your Bible.

Titus 1:16—Paul, in castigating certain false teachers in Crete, describes them as follows: "They profess to know God, but they deny him by their works. They are detestable, disobedient, unfit for any good work." Well, that's just gross! They are people who profess to know God, but their practices (i.e. their works) undercut their profession. They are ultimately disobedient with reference to "every good work." They refrain from doing good works, and such demonstrates the nature of their character.

Titus 2:7—Here Paul quickly moves from the younger men to address Titus (notice the shift to "yourself" and "your"). Notice what Paul says to this relatively young preacher: "Show yourself in all respects to be a model of good works. . . ." This "showing" is not for the purpose of ostentation. "Hey, look at how incredibly righteous and good I am!" Rather, it is to show the power of Christ in one's life, namely, to exalt the Lord, not one's self. The term "model" may be translated "example" or even "pattern," and it pertains to "good works."

Titus 2:11-14—These four verses constitute one sentence in the Greek, and it is one of the more profound and beautiful theological passages in the entire NT. While there is a discernible emphasis in this one sentence on the past, present, and future aspects concerning the salvation that believers have in Christ, the central thrust of this passage is to advise God's people about what salvation means for their present behavior. Indeed, the grace that saves you should transform you. Among other things, what Christ did in the past and what Christ will do in the future should motivate you and me to be "zealous for good works" in the present (vs. 14).

Titus 3:1-2—Here Paul demonstrates a fondness for the number seven. In vv. 1-2, he instructs Titus to remind the Christians at Crete of how they are to conduct themselves in society at large. Among these seven things that Paul lists in vv. 1-2, Paul says, "Remind them . . . to be ready for every good work" (vs. 1). [Incidentally, Paul will also delineate seven things in vs. 3 relative to their pre-conversion behavior.]

Titus 3:8—Here we come face to face with the fifth and final "trustworthy saying" in the so-called Pastoral Epistles, perhaps better classified as the Preaching Epistles (cf. 1 Tim. 1:15; 3:1; 4:9; 2 Tim. 2:11). In my estimation, the content of this "trustworthy saying" is found in vv. 4-7, which is just as profound and beautiful as 2:11-14. Paul lays out before us the foundation of our salvation, and then in vs. 8 he says, "This saying is trustworthy, and I want you to insist on these things, so that those who have believed in God *may be careful to devote themselves to good works*" (italics mine). Christians are to exercise caution in seeing to it that they maintain good works.

Titus 3:14—At the end of Paul's letter to Titus, after delineating certain "housekeeping" instructions, Paul says, "And let our people learn to devote themselves to good works, so as to help cases of urgent need, and not be unfruitful."

Having looked at all these passages in Paul's letter to Titus and their respective contexts, let me take a stab at summarizing what Paul related to Titus that God's people need to hear today: **In response to God's gift of salvation through Christ, which you accepted when you were baptized into Christ, zealously and eagerly devote yourselves to good works, so that you may help and influence others around you, bearing fruit in God's kingdom to God's glory.** Are you zealous for good works? Are you devoted to good works? Are you doing well at doing good?
